Sport Shots

A young Indian athlete studying at Oxford University in England is setting sport tongues wagging by training for his sprints by running a mile daily as fast as he can. He is E. L. R. Phillip from Madras University, winner of the Oxford Freshmen's 10 yards. He came to England with India's Olympic Games team and reached the second round of the 100 metres. Phillip's best time for his daily miles are around four minutes 55 seconds—good enough to win many club events in Britain. He has covered 100 metres in 10.6 seconds, the equivalent of 100 yards in 9.8 seconds, and may become the first Indian to win a sprint Blue at Oxford.

Middle distance runners have often been good sprinters. Sydney Wooderson, still world's half-mile record-holder, was capable of near 10 seconds for 100 yards as well as being a champion over a mile and three miles. Douglas Harris, the New Zealander, has recorded good times at distances around his half-mile speciality, but no running pundits can think of a top-line sprinter who trains on hard runs longer than half a mile.

JEANNE IS NOT DISAPPOINTED

Over Not Being Chosen to Represent Canada in World Skating Contest

VANCOUVER (CP)—Jeanne Matthews, 19-year-old Canadian junior figure skating champion, says that she is "not too disappointed" that she will not be asked to represent Canada in the world championships in Paris, February 11 and 14. She was commenting on a report from Montreal which earlier said that no Canadians would enter. The reason given by Norman V. S. Gregory, president of the Canadian Figure Skating Association, was that "we have no person whom we think is of championship calibre."

BELLOISE IS EASY WINNER

NEW YORK (CP)—Steve Belloise of New York, 157½ pounds, won a ten-round decision last night over the French middleweight champion, Robert Villemain, 159¼ pounds. Belloise threw dynamite with both hands but Villemain stuck it out gamely although badly mangled and bleeding freely.
