PRINCE RUPERT POSTAL RATES

Minister's Opposition to Cut
Draws Local Protest Along
Another Line

The Postmaster-General does not take kindly to a proposal from the Prince Rupert Chamber of Commerce that the basic letter rate be reduced from 4c. to 3c. Possibly, the Postmaster-General suggests in reply to the Chamber, the proposal for a reduction does not

take into account the plan to carry all first class mail on TransCanada Air Lines main lines by air. To reduce the postage rate as suggested, the minister suggests, would involve a deficit for a department, the aim of which was to provide "a reasonable service for the public without profit."

The reference of the minister to the air delivery of first class mail was taken as a cue by the Chamber at its meeting this week to protest at Prince Rupert mail not being included under this plan.

At the request of the local Chamber, the Canadian Chamber of Commerce national policy committee is considering the proposal of a reduction in the basic postal rate.

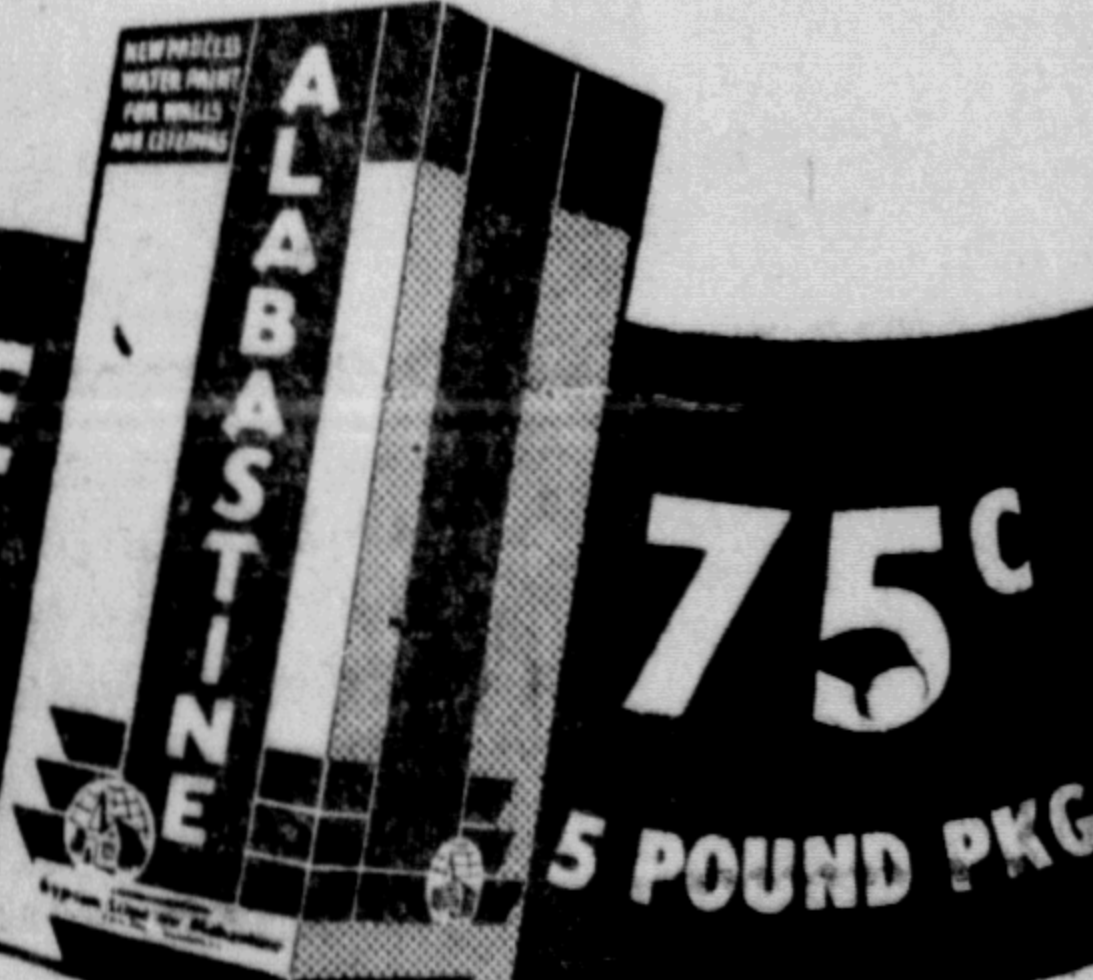

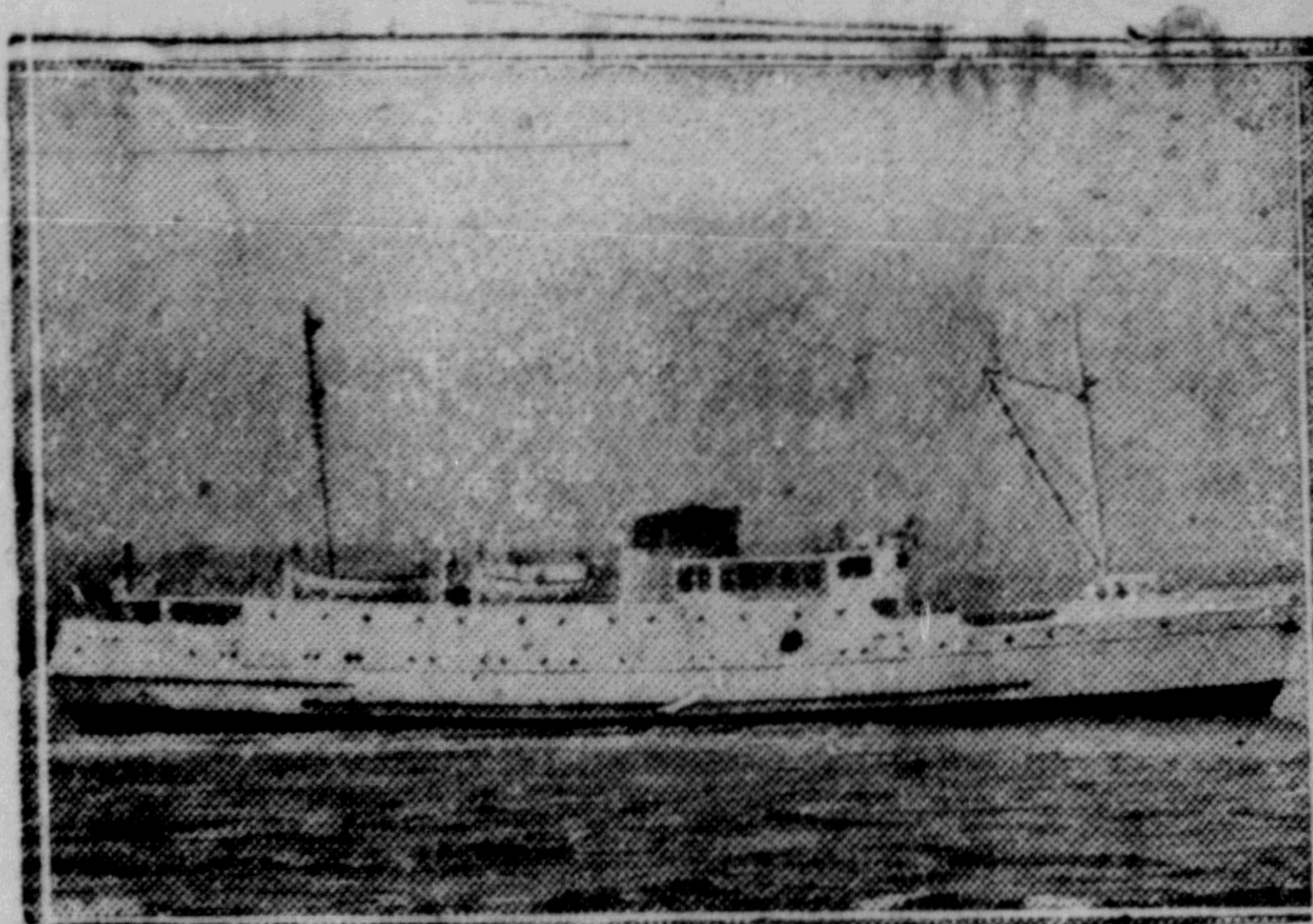
