CANTON (CP)—China's government opened a provisional capital here today and hurriedly brushed up defences by bringing down an army of 15,000 men from Shanghai. A government spokesman said that Canton would begin functioning as a capital today but few ministries were ready for business. Premier

Sun Fo and his foreign minister, Wu Te-Chen, had arrived from Shanghai. Acting President Li Tsung-Jen, however, is staying behind in Nanking.

Sources close to Li Tsung-Jen said today that the Communists had given an answer to his peace proposals, the reply being described as "at least a first step
