An Immense Project

A \$400,000,000 POWER development and aluminum plant project, the possibilities of which on the British Columbia coast high officials of the Aluminum Co. of Canada are here to investigate, would pale into almost insignificance any industrial enterprise yet undertaken on the west coast. Much as we appreciate and value our own show, such an enterprise as the Port Edward cellulose pulp mill project—a mere \$25,000,000—would be overshadowed.

As the industrial world looks to the Pacific Coast and the vast undeveloped resources here, money talk is beginning to assume tremendous terms. If this sort of thing goes on, British Columbia may ere long not be the third industrial province of Canada but may outstrip Ontario and Quebec. And why should it not? Certainly not because either Ontario or Quebec surpass us in potential of natural resources.

Particularly interesting to Prince Rupert, of course, is the fact that one of the sites to be investigated for the great aluminum power develonment should be at Gardner Canal, a mere hundred miles down the coast while another is in Dean Channel. a hundred or so miles further south. Of course, it may not come to either of these places, Bute Injet, some 200 miles north of Vancouver, having been the originally mentioned site.

Prince Rupert and northern British Columbia is bound to share in a great way in the impending industrial development of British Columbia.

THE WORD 'DOMINION'


