### POLICE URGE SPEED LIMIT SIGNS POSTED

Police Sgt. L. A. N. Potterton wants motorists to know that the city's speed limit is 25 miles an hour without having to go to court to find it out. He thinks that the city should post signs warning the driving public to tread lightly on the throttle.

"On more than one occasion," he wrote council last night, "I have been placed in the unhappy position of trying to explain in the police court the reason why an accused person can be prosecuted under Prince Rupert city bylaw No. 968 for driving at a greater rate of speed than 25 miles an hour when there are no signs erected to inform the public that 25 miles per hour is the maximum speed allowed.

"I feel that no further prosecutions should be made until such traffic sgins are erected."

He suggested, and council agreed, that signs should be "erected without further delay" at the highway entrance to the city, the top of the C.N.R. ramp, and the Cow Bay bridge. Council, however, could see no reason far placing one at the Morse Creek bridge, as suggested by the police chief.




