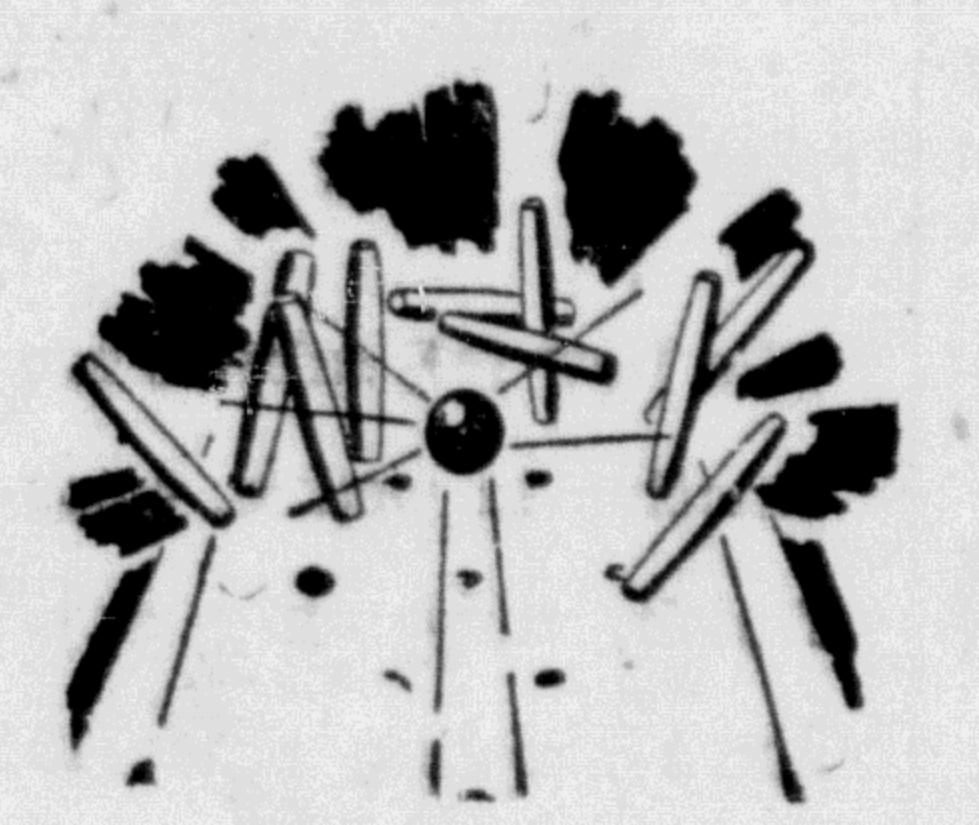

PROTECTION OF YOUNG LOBSTERS

HALIFAX, N.S.—Dr. S. A. Beatty of the Dominion Fisheries experimental station here, says that Nova Scotia fishermen are depleting the lobster industry by sending small and immature lobsters to the canneries in ever-increasing numbers. The canneries will accept them seven inches long. "Were the lobsters allowed to grow to the nine-inch minimum required for live shipment, fishermen would realize an additional 15 cents a pound and would be assured a steady supply."

This would mean a slack season while waiting for the crustaceans to reach maturity, but after a firm foundation and the fishermen would make a larger margin of profit, Dr. Beatty said.
