**EPIDEMIC HITS INTERIOR CITY**

PRINCE GEORGE — An epidemic which has struck at least 1,000 persons in this district in the past three weeks is taking heavy toll of the stamina of doctors and nurses. A call for at least 15 graduate nurses was sent out Wednesday by Hospital Superintendent T. Musto.

The hospital has only 80 beds and only eight available for isolation cases.

The disease seems to be a type of influenza, although it is not the streptococcal throat type. Doctors say the illness is not serious but it has complications such as abscesses in the glands.
