Canadian Amateur Golf in Semi-Finals Today

HAMILTON, Ont. — Two Canadians and two Americans—one the defending champion, Frank Stranahan of the United States—survived two rounds of match play in the Canadian Amateur golf championship yesterday and made certain of a Canada-United States finish tomorrow.

Matched in the two semi-final brackets today are: Walter McElroy of Vancouver vs. Joe Stoddard of Hamilton. Frank Stranahan of Toledo vs. Larry Dana of Bradford, Pennsylvania.

These are meeting in 36 holes of match play today and the winners play another 36 holes on Saturday for the title. McElroy was one down to Stoddard at the first hole but was one up at half way mark. Stranahan was also one up at the half way mark.

Blond Walter McElroy is favored by some observers to win his way into the final tomorrow following a convincing four and three win over long-hitting Bill Thompson of Guelph yesterday. McElroy was two up at the nine-hole turn and then won the tenth and fifteenth to take the match. Later McElroy pushed 19-year old Gerry Kesseling of Kitchener aside two up.

Two years ago McElroy was runner-up to Kesseling by one stroke in the final of the Canadian junior golf championship.

STRIKES BEGAN SPLIT

The uneasy alliance became definitely strained towards the end of last year when Italy was threatened with paralysis of her economic activity by extensive strikes. Non-Communist elements of that time alleged the unions were being used purely as a political and revolutionary weapon by the communists.

The parting of the ways between the two groups was made public this spring when the non-Communist groups insisted on attending the meeting in London of trade union representatives of the 16 nations benefitting under the Marshall Plan.

The recent meeting of the non-Communist union leaders with members of their respective parties to discuss the 'Alliance of Syndicates' is not, according to these circles, aimed at breaking up the General Confederation of Italian Labor "at least not for the present."

"What we want to do," these circles say, "is to reinforce the unity of the labor syndicates. The purpose of the Alliance is constructive. It is to ensure that union activity is devoted to the purpose of the well-being of the working classes."

The April elections gave much stimulus to opposition sectors in the labor union, particularly since these sectors now form the new coalition government of Signor Alcide de Gasperi.

Leader of the battle against the Communists is Giulio Pastors, 46-year old father of nine children and secretary-general of the confederation representing the Christian Democrat Unions.

## SUNDAY TERRACE BUS SERVICE

Permission by the provincial Public Utilities Commission for a city bus line to make passenger trips to Terrace on Sundays will permit city residents without cars to spend one day a week at the sun-bathed interior town. The company, which operates a scheduled daily service to Port Edward, plans to begin the Sunday Terrace run this week-end, leaving Prince Rupert in the morning and returning in the late evening.

## APPROVAL OF WATER WORKS

TERRACE—Approval of the Terrace waterworks loan bylaw has been received from Victoria by the board of village commissioners which was in session Wednesday night. The village is now awaiting approval from the inspector of loans of an application from a government guarantee of its bonds.

The commissioners expressed desire to see the new waterworks under construction as soon as possible but the completion of certain matters is necessary before the new system can be installed. Work has started on the hauling of water pipes from Port Edward.

The list of trade licences has been reviewed with some additions being made. Only in a few cases has the trade licence been increased beginning from July 15 to January 15.

The matter of a sidewalk on Lakelse Avenue is deferred until the Public Works Department brings the shovel into town so that gravel can be hauled for the sidewalk.

All unused school equipment in schools in the district which have been closed is to be collected and brought to Terrace for redistribution.

The advisability of buying a

carload of coal for the schools here was discussed and all were in favor of it.

The appointment of new teachers is proceeding satisfactorily. Three more are needed for the Terrace area and others will be needed throughout the whole district.
