Barrel will be dropped from the Terrace bridge at 2 a.m., June 30, and will finish at a line just below Little's Mill at East Kwinitsa.

Skeena River current.

Force and direction of wind and tide.

The barrel was timed over a portion of the course on May 7, 1949, and travelled at a speed of three miles an hour.

Should the barrel be obstructed it will be released as promptly as possible by the convoying party and diverted into the main channel.


