## Income Rises, Tax Rate Same

Because of the increased value of taxable real estate in the city this year, receipts from taxes are expected to be up \$15,351 to \$344,168. The mill rate remains at 60.

At the end of July last year 91.2 per cent of total taxes had been collected. The percentage this year is roughly the same at 91.16. At the end of July \$313,730 had been collected compared with last year's \$299,648 at the same time. A great part of the increase in property value can be credited to new construction during the year although some of it is because of sale of city owned property.
