Convening the tea will be Mrs. A. Gillanders. Mrs. W. Martin will take charge of the homecooking and needlework stalls and Mrs. W. McIntosh will convene the "sandy stall" Mrs. Haukland has charge of decorating the hall.

Committee Reports and Other Matters at Wednesday's Session

TERRACE—There was a good attendance of members at Wednesday night's meeting of the Board of Trade which was held in the Credit Union Hall. President C. J. Norrington, president, was in the chair.

New members, A. J. Harmon and E. J. Killis were admitted to the Board.

Two new committees were incorporated in the by-laws—housing and utilities. The chairman and committee members of the housing committee were chosen at a former meeting and Mr. Norrington appointed Mr. McAdams, Mr. J. S. Smith and Mr. Gillanders to the utilities committee.

In the committee's reports, Harry King, chairman of the agricultural committee, stated that there was a need for a weed inspector in the district as he had had several inquiries if there was one here.

There was also a report that Allan Sheardown of Prince Rupert has an organization ready to ship home market products to Juneau, Alaska where he is now shipping fluid milk.

Sam Kirkaldy stated that he has received word that about 50 new postal boxes have been sent to Terrace and these will be installed without delay.

D. G. Little stated that the copies of the resolutions which were made at the last ratepayers' meeting had been sent to the Inspector of Municipalities for approval and further word on them is expected soon.

Total board dues paid up amount to \$132 with 30 paid up members.
