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





iginated the work of its comple-It runs from Prince George. north via Summit Lake to Fort McLeod and east through Pine Pass to Dawson Creek. Between Prince George and Vancouver the Cariboo Highway would be used by trucks and other traffic. The road is a 30-foot gravelled highway suitable for heavy

Seattle and other coastal points already forecast that its use for Alaska Highway freighting will mean a saving of two days as compared with the Edmonton route.

When completed an exclusive franchise for passenger and freighting traffic is to be held by the Pacific and Great Eastern Railway company, which is government-operated.

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
