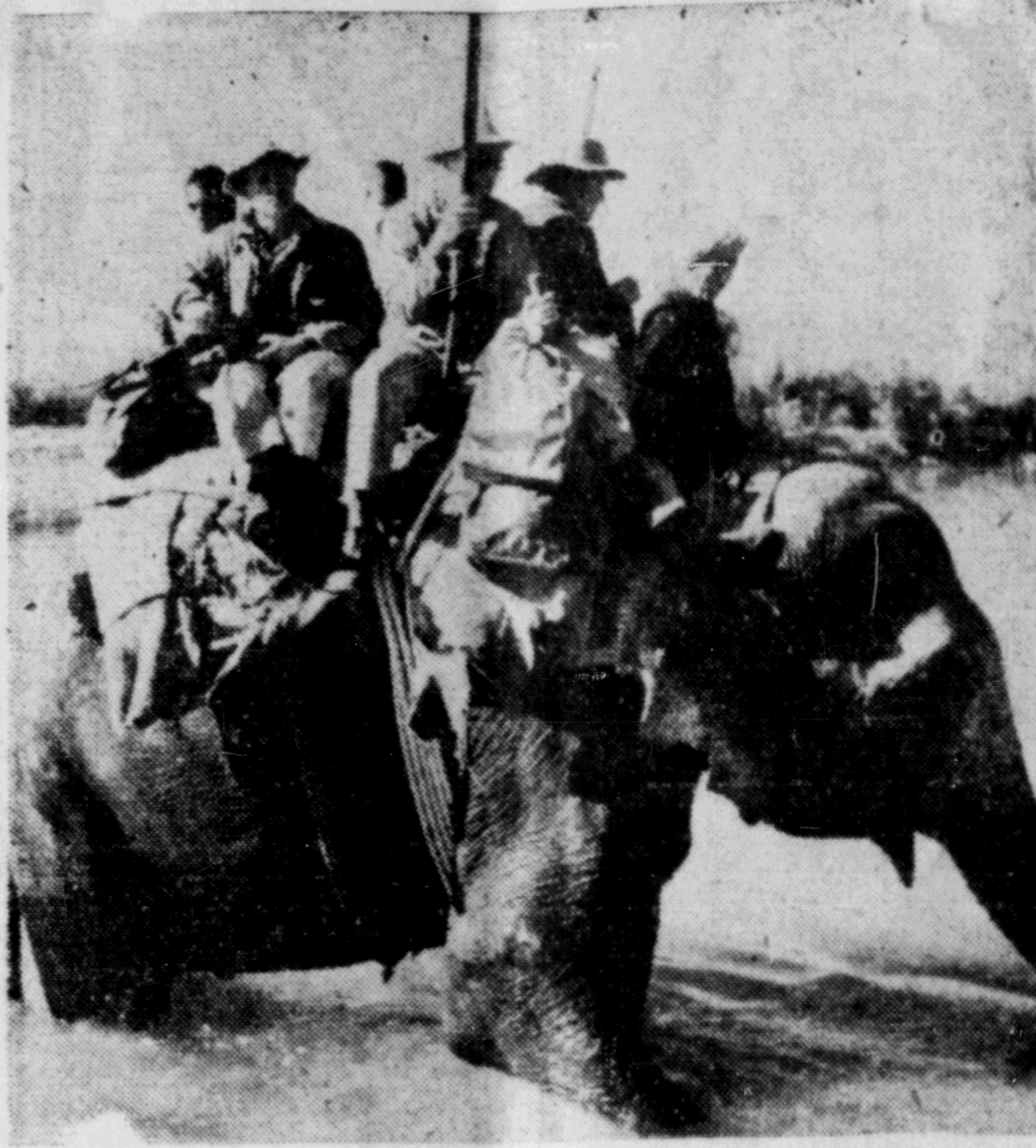

PRIMITIVE LOCOMOTIVE IN DARKEST AFRICA—Some expeditions penetrate even darkest Africa over some pretty fair roads and the trip is no more exciting than a Sunday spin. This expedition into Nepal, however, decided to explore the wild Karnali Valley where white men have never been seen by the natives, and were therefore forced off the beaten track and forced to use a primitive locomotive method consisting of three elephants. With the equipment and one thing and another, it became rather crowded on board the pachyderms. The expedition, incidentally, is exploring the secrets of Nepal for the National Geographic Society, Yale University and the Smithsonian institution. Crossing the Karnali Valley stream here on elephant back are, (left to right), a native helper, Edward Migdalski of Yale's Peabody museum; Howard C. Weaver, back to camera, of Fredonia, N.Y.; Dr. Dillon Ripley, associate curator of zoology at Yale and leader of the expedition; Richard G. Mack of Del Monte, Calif., and Lane county, Oregon; and the elephant's mahout.

VANCOUVER—Thirty-four Canadian Seamen's Union members were acquitted late yesterday on charges of unlawful assembly in connection with incidents aboard the strikebound steamer Riverside here.

Wild cheers rocked the courtroom when the verdict was handed down.

Mr. Justice H. S. Wood pointed out that the crown had not proven that each man was a participant.

648 SO FAR NOMINATED

OTTAWA—A total of 648 candidates have been nominated across Canada for the federal election on June 27 and it is expected 1000 will be in the field when the nominations officially close June 13 in the most of the 260 constituencies. There were 954 contestants for 245 seats in the 1945 election. Liberals lead in this campaign's nominations so far with 242 while Progressive Conservatives have 210 and the C.C.F. 154.

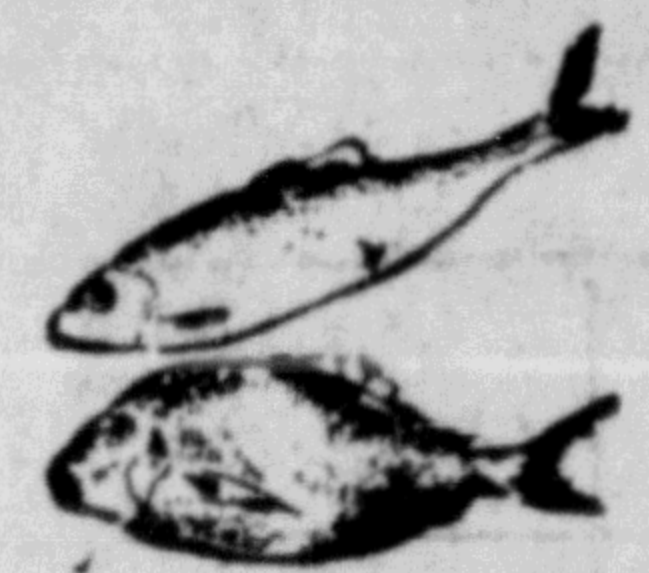
