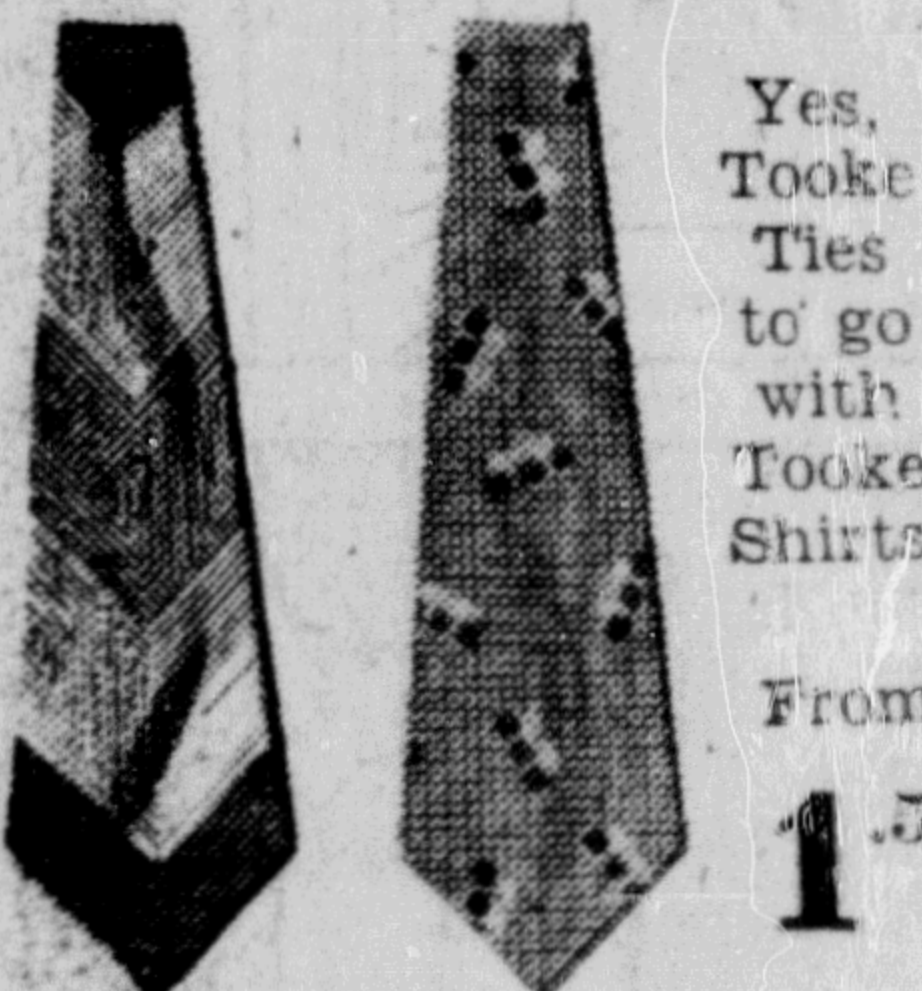

Music In Plants Is Modern Touch

STOKE-ON-TRENT, England (C)—Most of the children who were yellow "A penny for Guy Fawkes" here got a shilling. How practical can you be in a town where history stalks the cobblestoned streets?

How can you stay clear of sentiment when the brick kilns of some 150 potteries are silhouetted like giant champagne bottles against an evening sky?

Stoke is a city of some 270,000 composed of six small towns. In and about are massive slag piles heaped with the refuse of more than two centuries of pottery-making.

The soot from the kilns has left its mark on the slate grey dwellings of the workers. But crisp white curtains flutter at the windows and they say the smoke nuisance has been cut considerably in the last few years.

Up-to-date equipment has been installed in the plants, and good working conditions generally prevail. There are many women employees doing such skilled jobs as painting the designs on plates. At Wedgwood they prepare the raised ornamentation for the china—a craft introduced by Wedgwood in the 18th century.

MUSIC IN FACTORIES In some cases the women work against a background of music, a feature common to many British factories. Manufacturers feel music keeps their employees happy in their work

and also speeds up production. Handwork remains all-important in china manufacture.

A cup—whether semi-porcelain or bone china—must have its handle put on individually. Its design either painted or stamped by hand.

"Every piece goes through 30 hands before you get it," said Bill Hoare of Johnson Brothers. "So you see it's difficult to turn them out like sausages."

Then there are the "firings"—trips into the furnaces—which may total as many as five before the color is fixed.

In addition skilled labor is hard to come by. There aren't many women who can graft a handle on a cup as swiftly as Mrs. O. Smith who has been doing the same job in one of the plants for the last 12 years.

Some of the firms have imported skilled help. In one of the Johnson plants Italian girls are working. There also is a lone Canadian, Adam Russell of Hamilton, Ont., who "polishes" one of the final processes through which the dishes must go.

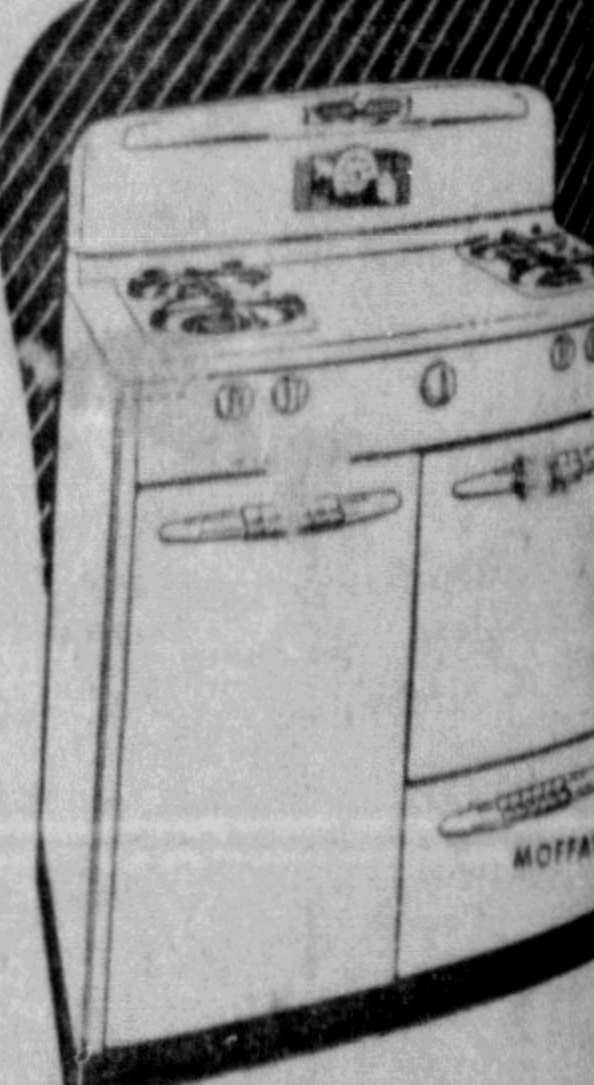
