

Measure into large bowl, 1/2 c. lukewarm water, 1 tsp. granulated sugar; stir until sugar is dissolved. Sprinkle slowly with 1 envelope Fleischmann's Royal Fast Rising Dry Yeast. Let stand 10 min., THEN stir well. Scald 1 c. milk and stir in 5 tbs. granulated sugar, 2 tsps. salt; cool to lukewarm. Add to yeast mixture and stir in 1/2 cup lukewarm water. Beat in 3 c. once-sifted bread flour; beat

well. Beat in 4 ths, melted shortening. Work in 3 c. more once-sifted bread flour. Knead until smooth and elastic; place in greased bowl and brush top with melted butter or shortening. Cover and set in warm place, free from draught. Let rise until doubled in bulk. Punch down dough in bowl, grease top and let rise again until nearly doubled. Punch down dough and roll out, half at a time, into a rectangle a scant 1/4" thick; lift dough, cover with cloth and let rest 5 min. Brush with melted butter or shortening; cut into strips 11/2" wide. Pile 7 strips together; cut oven, 400°, 15-20 min.
