

There is also speculation as to the plans of Union Steamships Ltd. for coastal service now that the summer runs are ending. Expectations are that a twicea-week service between Vancouver and Prince Rupert will be maintained and possibly improved. The improvement which it is heard may be made would be effected by operating a vessel, possibly one of the converted corvettes which have become so popular, on a large direct run between Vancouver north and south with extension of the voyage out of Prince Rupert each week to Queen Charlotte Island points, making the direct service to the Islands out of here. Thus, it appears, would be eliminated the costly business of making the long haul to the Islands out of Vancouver. A decision on the matter is expected soon. Meantime, the Coquitlam continues on the run between Vancouver and Prince Rupert via the Islands with the Camosun on the Vancouver-Prince Rupert-Alice Arm-Stewart run and the Catala on the cannery run between Prince Rupert and Van-


