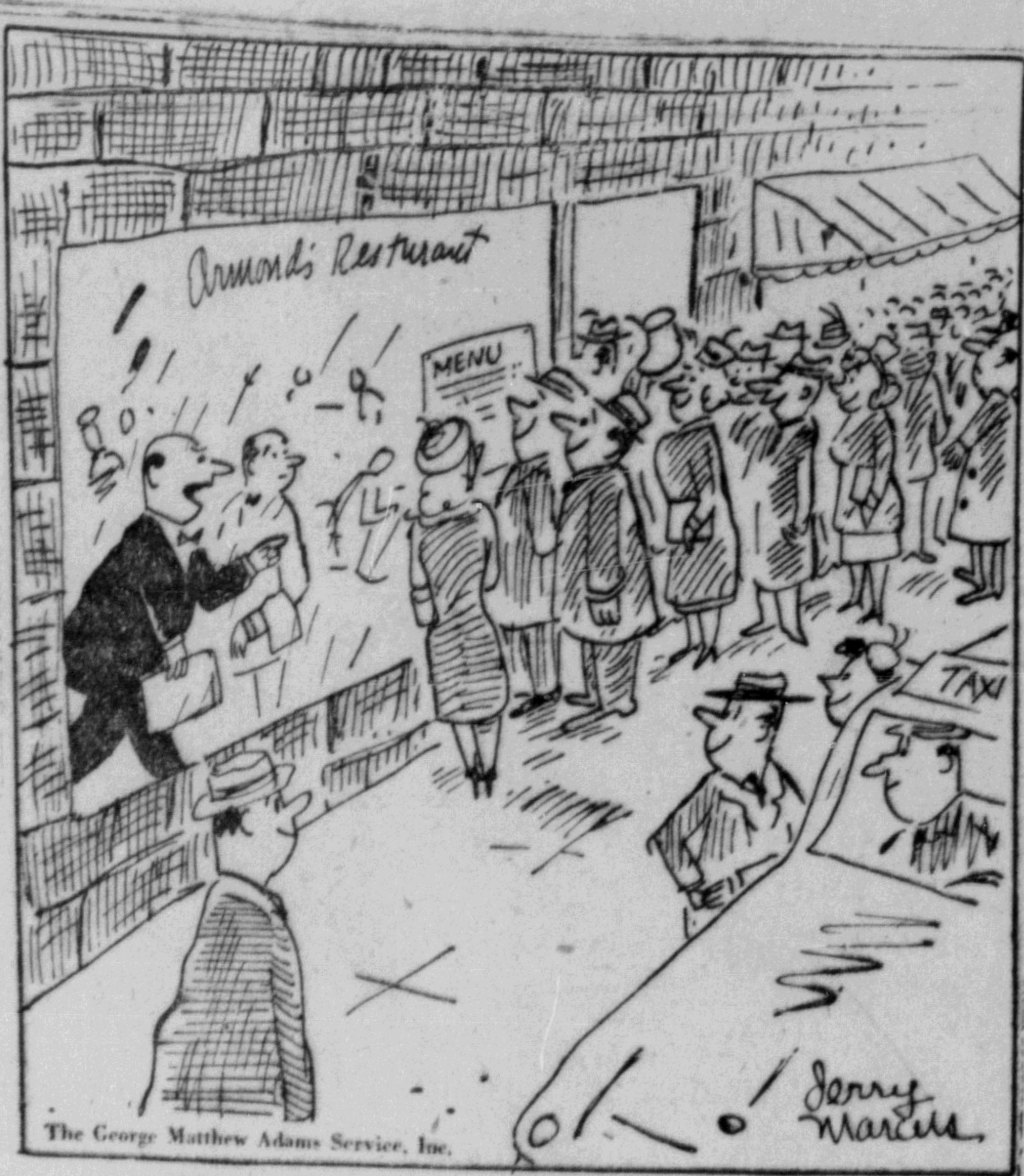

ERNEST LLOYD GARDINER DIES

Death took place at the Prince Rupert General Hospital yesterday of Ernest Lloyd Gardiner in his seventy-fifth year. Deceased, who had been in the employ of the Canadian National Railways for a number of years, formerly resided at Aleza Lake until moving to Prince Rupert to live three years ago.

Mr. Gardiner was a veteran of the First World War serving overseas with the Twenty-Eighth Battalion, Canadian Expeditionary Force.

He leaves to mourn his passing, his widow, 1451 Plaza, Prince Rupert, one son Raymond L. Gardiner, and a daughter, Mrs. H. E. Smith, all residents of Prince Rupert.

The funeral will take place from Grenville Chapel Sunday next, Rev. Archdeacon Hodgson officiating, and interment will be in the Soldier's Plot, Fairview cemetery with members of the local branch of the Canadian Legion in attendance.
