Election Next Year

Ottawa. (C) — The capital's wise money is going on October, 1949, for Canada's next general election. Despite some predictions that the government will play out its full string into the summer of 1950, most informed opinion here leans away from this view.

At the moment, the question is still in the realm of pure speculation since the cabinet has not even discussed it yet. But the political weathervane points to next fall although the winds may have shifted considerably by the time it rolls around.

It will depend on Rt. Hon. Louis St. Laurent, who will be taking over in November as Prime Minister, plus such factors as results of any by-election tests in the meantime and reaction to the government's expected tax-cutting budget of next spring.

Those who suggest a 1950 election base their thinking on the idea that Mr. St. Laurent will want as long a tenure as he can get as Prime Minister before going to the country. He will want, they say, to get the electorate accustomed to the idea of a St. Laurent government.

On the other hand, there is the consideration that it is not considered good strategy to let a government term run its full course in peacetime unless there are compelling reasons. The opposition can play on the thought that the government is afraid to go to the people at the end of the traditional four-year period.

GARDINER FOR 1949

The government's own political craftsman, Agriculture Minister Gardiner, is betting against 1950. It's 10 to one, he told Regina Liberals last week, that the polling will be "long before" 1950.

Mr. Gardiner may just have been aiming at keeping the party stalwarts on their toes, but

there are valid arguments backing him up.

The next parliamentary session, starting in January, is expected to bring considerable tax reductions and probably enlarged security measures.

The government will want a space of time between these moves and polling day, in order to let their full effect hit the public. But it won't want a gap big enough to let the public forget them by the time it goes to the polls.

That, say the experts, would appear to rule out an election immediately after the close of the session, which probably will be about June.

From late June until mid-September is considered a poor time to call an election, since farmers are busy at harvest, so the guess is it will go over to October. That would dispose of it before the onset of cold weather.

The last general election was held June 11, 1945.

The current standing in the Commons is: Liberals, 124; Progressive-Conservatives, 66; C.C.F., 32; Social Credit, 13; others, eight; vacancies, two.
