

New Housing Deal

T last the federal government appears to have / \ come through with a scheme for assistance in housing financing that is made to order for Prince Rupert. The details of the scheme, which would be financed by the Dominion with assistance by the province, were disclosed to the city council yesterday afternoon by City Clerk H. D. Thain who this week in Victoria attended a conference of municipal representatives with provincial government and Central Mortgage and Housing Corpor-

With such a scheme of assistance as this available, there would appear to be a real solution to the housing problem. Not much longer now should the condition exist where it is impossible or nearly so to obtain housing accomodation. It remains to be seen whether there will be much building for rental, the assistance of which is also provided for, but, without that, the scheme seems to bring within the reach of almost everyone the possibility of building for himself. The down payment of one-sixth (including the price of the lot) or the lease-purchase plan, whereby one can lease and build up the down payment as he goes, constitute attractive and practical propositions indeed-even to the person of most modest immediately available means.

It is to be recalled what a boon the deal on the wartime housing units in Prince Rupert was to the former renters who were able to become owners under the most easy and favorable of terms. This new scheme of aid to home builders appears to have possibilities of almost equal facility and advantage. It is to be expected that the 1950 city council will see to it, that immediate steps are taken to ensure Frince Rupert is organized to meet the housing crisis under this scheme.

There appears to be little disposition for private enterprise to meet the housing shortage from an investment basis, except for the apartment project involving the former administration building which will fill a real need.

Real home owners make stable community of good citizens. The new government housing deal seems to be the instrument that can really bring that about.

THE DOUKHOBORS REPENT

HERE is no reason to doubt the good faith and intentions of the long troublous Sons of Freedom Doukhobors in their avowal of renunciation of their troublesome and defiant tactics which for years have been marked by burnings, bombings, nude parades and general nuisances They have announced their repentance for their sins and their resolve to sin no more.

The official declaration of the Sons should be an important step of progress toward the settlement of this long vexed problem. That they will follow up their resolve with a respecting of same in good faith can be expected with some confidence They have had their faults but at least the worst of the Doukhobors have never been charged with duplicity. Their obstinate defiance has been one of their most baffling weapons.

The recanting of the Sons of Freedom from their unlawful ways probably marks the best degree of progress that has so far been made in the solving of the problem with which they are concerned.


