Death has claimed another pioneer of Prince Rupert district in the person of Harry McCavour, veteran Skeena River canneryman, who succumbed to a heart attack in Vancouver on Sunday.

Mr. McCavour was born at St. John, New Brunswick, upwards of 60 years ago and came to this coast as a young man. Identified with the B.C. Packers he was located at old Balmoral cannery and later at Claxton and Sunnyside. A year ago he moved to Vancouver and had been employed in that area. He had not been well since last winter.

A widow and son, Don McCavour, survive in Vancouver. Mr. McCavour was a member of a local Masonic lodge.
