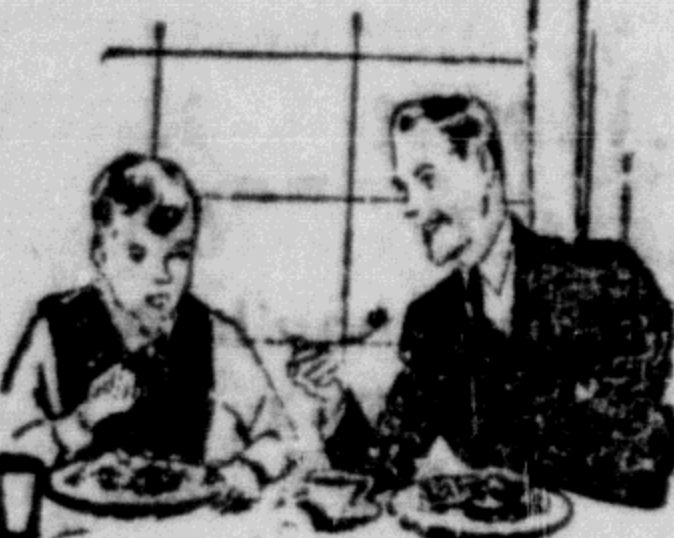

## NEW MAIL CARS NOW

Modern Railway Equipment For Postal Service

**MONTREAL**—The first of ten new mail and express railway cars, Canadian in design and construction, was received here yesterday by the Canadian National Railways. It was officially inspected by W. J. Turnbull, deputy postmaster general, and Geo. Herring, director of communications, Post Office Department, Ottawa; J. T. Whiteford, manager, passenger service bureau, Canadian National Railways, and G. E. McCoy, assistant chief of car equipment, C.N.R.

New and enlarged facilities are provided in this modern railway postal unit for the sorting and handling of mail by postal clerks while the car is travelling between cities. Built at Hamilton by National Steel Car Company for the C.N.R., it has a 30-foot mail compartment equipped with 360 letter cases, 26 newspaper boxes and 52 mail bag racks.
