Closing date for Area Three halibut season has been set for June 15 by the International Fisheries Commission, terminating a fishery period that can accurately be called a "flash" because of its lightninglike duration—a mere six weeks. It will close just two weeks after Area Two ends on June 1, next Monday night—after 46 days.

H.M.C.S. Chatham itself is standing by in readiness for disaster relief work on the Skeena River. The diesel tug Marysville and the local harbor craft are standing by for orders.

> While no houses or chicken coops have been seen floating in Chatham Sound during the last week, it is not unlikely that they might be. Communities such as Usk and Salvus, where the water has reached to the top of single story buildings might well expect to lose a small building or two. However, there is a substantial footage of cottonwood, spruce and cedar floating to the sea. Boats on the Skeena report the river filled with snags and deadheads. The area around Haysport and other river mouth points probably will be a paradise for beachcombers when the water subsides. There is a lot more than silt being carried along.

In dry dock here is the 45-foot halibutter Nornen getting her starboard side partially restarboard side partially replanked after going aground and nearly sinking off Squadaree this week. She was brought in by the Canadian Fishing Co. packer Hillside after being refloated by several trolling boats on Wednesday. Loaded with halibut, the Nornen, Capt. J. O. Nansen, was reported heading for Squadaree to unload when she struck. She will be several days receiving repairs. The Nornen is a New Westminster boat.

Halibut prices have been maintaining a substantial level of 19 and 20 cents a pound for mediums, mainly because of the United States demand. However, there have been few spring salmon showing in Chatham Sound and fishing on the Skeena has been halted because of the swollen condition of the river and the number of deadheads floating down.

Annual inspection of the complement of H.M.C.S. Chatham navy reserve division has been set ahead one night because of the rail washout. The inspection was originally to have been held next Tuesday night but owing to the inability of Capt




