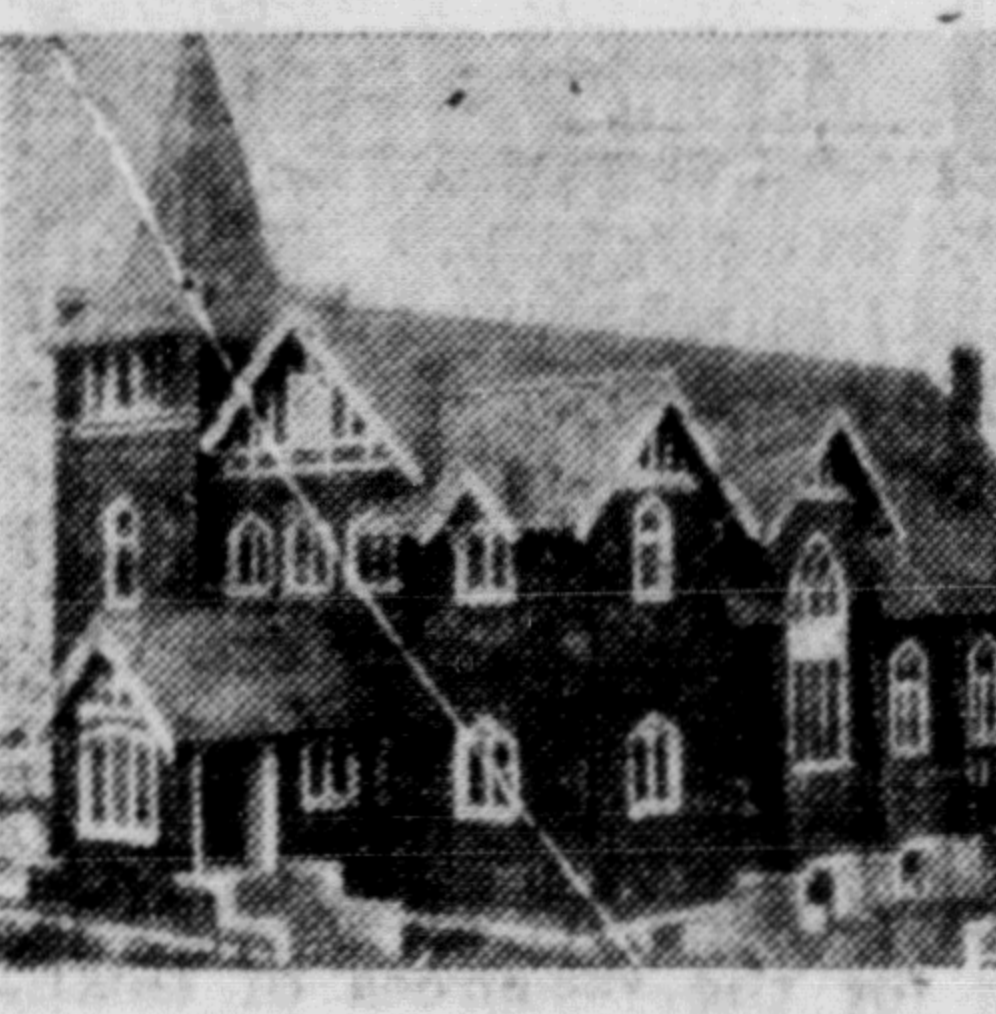

SATURDAY SERMON

THE WAGES OF SIN

By Rev. F. Antrobus, First Baptist Church
"For the wages of sin is death; but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord."—Romans 6:23.

There are three great contrasts here in this passage: God is contrasted with sin; wages with free gift; and life with death. Sin is an employer of labor, perhaps the most extensive employer in the world. He is bound by strong law to pay wages, to every one who works for him. It is true he does not pay in full at the end of each week, or month, for his kind of wages is unfavorable to this method.

Nevertheless, every day of labor becomes a debt to the master, Sin, and is kept record of, and will be recompensed by Him in due course, as long as the relationship between himself and the worker continues to hold, and the worker remains the servant of sin to the end. Small installments of wages are paid as time goes on, but the day of reckoning comes at the end of life. One thing these small installments do, as the human body does when overstrained, is to give strong hints and warnings of recompense which comes in the end.

Everyone agrees with the statement, that the 'wages of sin is death,' in the case of the dishonest, the intemperate, the grossly immoral, the murderer, who reap the fruit of their own evil deeds in their own bodies, or in civil punishment. Great cause have such persons to say, 'In serving sin, I have served a just master. I have received an exact equivalent for each sinful desire.'

It is not so obvious but just as true, that this law follows in cases far short of criminal excess. We see it in the way sin pays off in kind. Let a Christian man neglect prayer, Bible reading, the Sabbath Day, or anything which to him, is the known will of God; to him it is sin. He supposes himself free to resume any of these interrupted habits when he will; he thinks he is his own master, and what he has willed one day, he may tomorrow will the opposite.

Young and old think they may always and quickly recover any pet indulgence of the hour, and regain the right way easily just by a decision. But Sin is

standing over such and mocking their vain calculations. Man has done a piece of work for Sin today and Sin will pay him his wages, in inclining him to do the same tomorrow. Tomorrow, the voice of inclination will be stronger, the voice of conscience weaker, his will more under bondage. He will more likely do again what he has done once, find it less difficult, and at the same time feel less remorseful. "Great oaks from little acorns grow," so it is with sin. An evil imagination encouraged, an impure thought harbored, an unholy ambition controlling us; and the work is begun; what the progression and end will be, no human tongue can describe, but the Bible says, it is 'death.' "There is a way which seems right to a man, but the end thereof are the ways of death." I beseech you in Jesus name, take Jesus Christ as your Saviour and Master: break with your present master and serve the Lord.
