



HOW TO SPOT PHONIES-This is an artist's conception of the various methods of detecting counterfeit \$10 bills which have been reported in various Canadian cities in the last few weeks. On bogus bills, the red serial number smears when moistened and rubbed. There is an absence of small green dots, called planchettes, which appear on genuine bills. Portions of the printing are blurred and indistinct and there is a definite difference in the ink on the reverse side (C. P. Photo) of the note.


