## Bo-Me-Hi Wins Senior Game But Intermediate Match Provided Upset

Bo-Me-Hi strengthened their hold on second place in the Senior Basketball League last night by virtue of their 61 to 54 victory over Brownwoods. The losers were the best team in the first three periods of the game and looked like the winners until that time. High School staged a smart rally in the

final period to overcome the Brownwoods' lead at 46 all, and then forged ahead 52 to 46 before Brownwoods made a comeback to tighten it up again at 52 to 50. High School really poured it on at this stage, scoring nine points in the final minutes and holding Brownwoods down to four. The students earned their victory with their aggressive play and dogged persistence.

The game was marred by poor sportsmanship all evening. High School continually and audibly questioned every call made by the referees and, when the going got tough for Brownwoods in the final quarter, they were guilty of the same practice. It was in this period that the referees tightened up on the loose talk and Brownwoods had

four technical fouls called on them, before they realized that back talk to the referees does not accumulate dividends. Tempers also flared in that last quarter and Brownwoods lost Sunberg when he clipped Carlson, who retaliated, both players being banned from the game.

Spring again came through with a big 25 points, and played a much better team game than usual, feeding his forwards, a habit that he can well develop.

Shier played a brilliant game for Brownwoods, snagging rebound after rebound and scoring an impressive 23 points. Carlson, with 14, and Pierce with 11, both played useful ball and sparked their team with their hard work. Referees Dominato and Slatta kept the game well under control, even in the last hectic quarter when tempers flared and a few long-nourished grudges were being evened off.

North Star scored the biggest upset of the year when they took a 34 to 33 victory from the league-leading Merchants. Fashion was idle for the evening but moved back into a first-place tie with Merchants by virtue of the loss.

North Star earned their victory. They led during the first half, out-scoring Merchants 12 to 7 in the first quarter, holding nearly even in the second, which ended 12-14. Merchants made a strong come-back in the third quarter to tie the score at 26 all, in the last quarter North Star again took over the lead to eke out their close win.

The win could have been more decisive if they had converted more of their last period foul shots, as they missed six in this quarter. Merchants also failed to convert their fouls making only 3 of 15 possible all evening.

It was the best game in this league in many a day and North Star are certainly a team to be reckoned with in future seasons. They played all the way through as a smart team unit, and at one time dazzled the fans with a roll play that put Smith in the clear for a perfect lay-up shot which he converted. In the final period they managed to keep the lead in their possession by a smart stalling game which gave the control of the ball for the last minute and ten seconds.

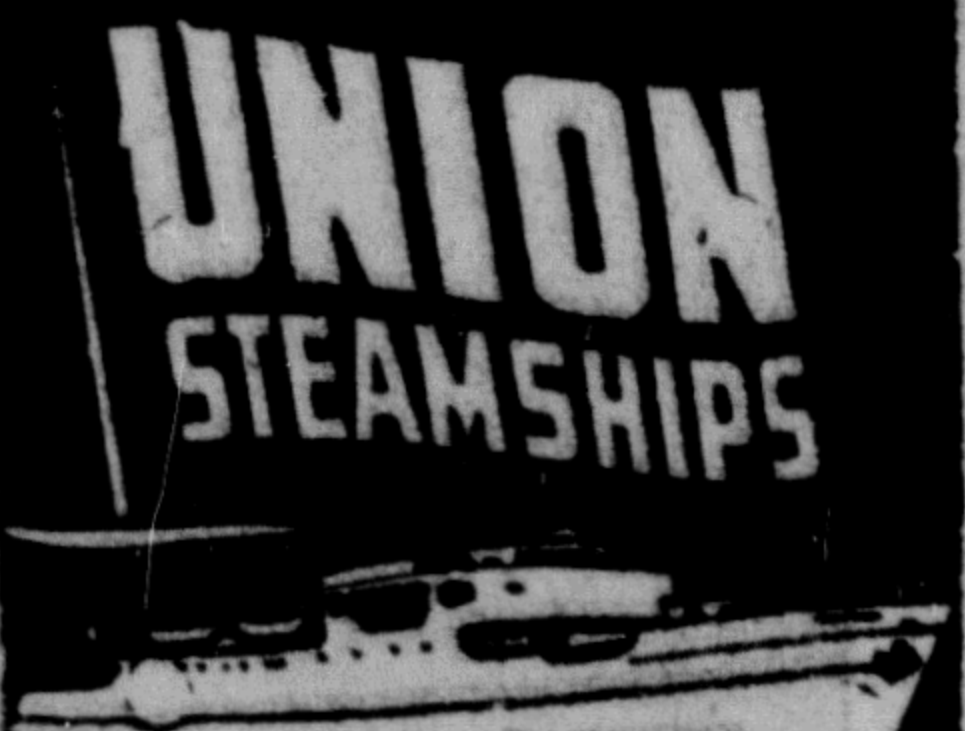
