Sport Shots

The veterans were back at their old stand doing a classy bit of fielding business during the 1950 American League baseball season. In contrast to 1949 when younger players took over numerous defensive laurels, the past year of play in the junior loop saw such established stars as Phil Rizzuto, Bobby Doerr, George Kell, Phil Masi, Dizzy Trout, Mickey Vernon and Hot Evers walk off with top marks afield.

Evers, lanky blond outfield ace of the Detroit Tigers who had a great year at the plate with a .323 mark, established a new American League outfield record for players appearing in 100 or more games a season. Hoot fielded 9970 through 139 games, surpassed by Joe DiMaggio passing the old mark of .9963 set by Joe DiMaggio in the same number of games in 1947. Evers, handling 341 chances, had but one error.

The year 1950 was a big one for little Phil Rizzuto of New York, the league's most valuable player. The Scooter duplicated his 1949 feat of pacing the shortstops afield, the past season seeing him turn in an average of .982, just a point ahead of Vern Stephens of Boston, who had a fine year afield with a .981 mark. .9817 when carried out, fell just short of the league record set by Lou Boudreau of Cleveland in 1947. In addition, Rizzuto put two other classy marks into the record book. Phil went 58 straight games without an error to erase the previous shortstop league mark of 42, made by Eddie Joost in 1947-1948. Rizzuto also handled 288 chances without a bobbie to wine out Joost's old league mark of 226.

First base honors were shared by veteran Mickey Vernon of Washington and Cleveland's big Luke Easter, each coming in with a .991 mark. Ed Robinson of Chicago and Washington finished a point behind.

An old pro' of the Boston club, Bob Doerr, captured fielding

honors for second basemen with an average of .988, while another veteran, Phil Masi of Chicago, was tops defensively among the catchers, fielding .996, three points better than Cleveland's Jim Hegan. Yogi Berra of New York had the most passed balls, seven. Third base honors went to Detroit's star, George Kell, who had but nine bobbles on 510 chances for a .982 mark.

Among the pitchers, 28 moundsmen had perfect fielding marks, with Trout of Detroit having the most chances, 58. Mel Parnell of Boston handled 75 chances with only one error, while most chances were accepted by Cleveland's right-hand star Bob Lemon. Bob handled 92 chances with only four errors. Detroit and Boston shared team fielding laurels, each having a club mark of .981. Detroit handled the most chances, 6,218, while Philadelphia completed the most double plays, 208. The Boston Red Sox committed the fewest errors, 111.

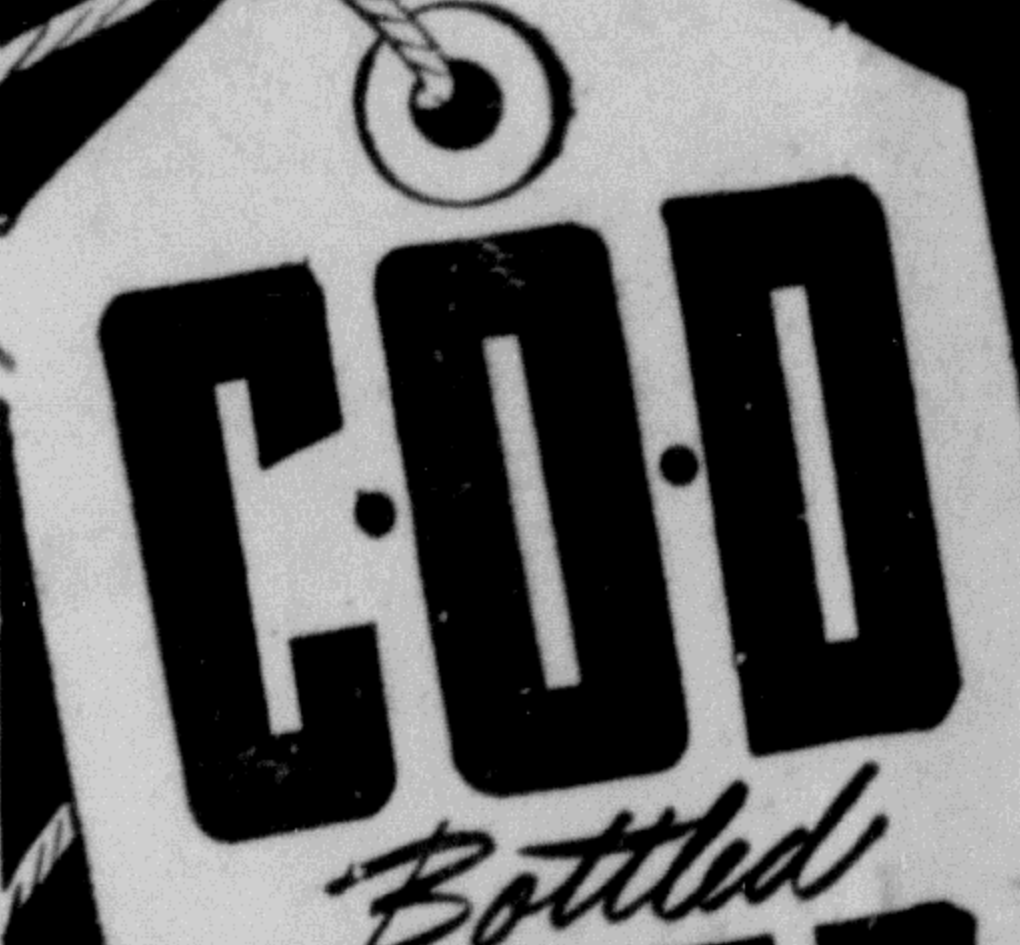
