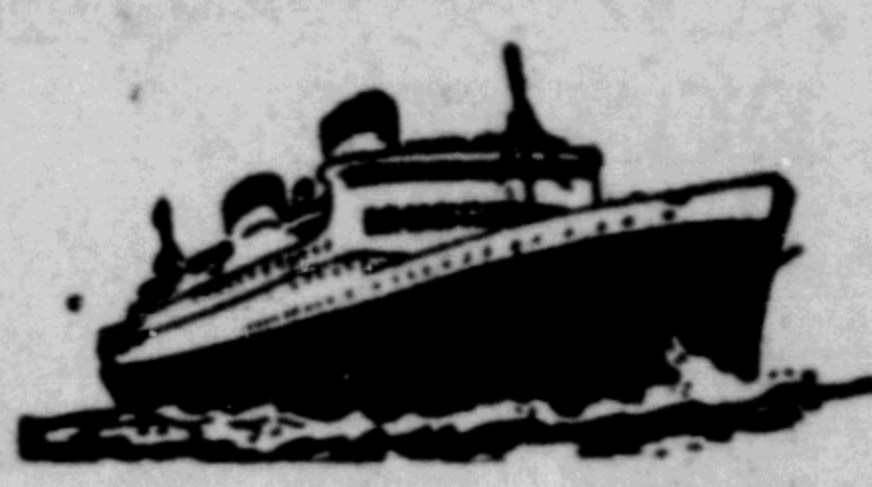

Bob Johnson and Bob DeSpelder, young fellows who voy-

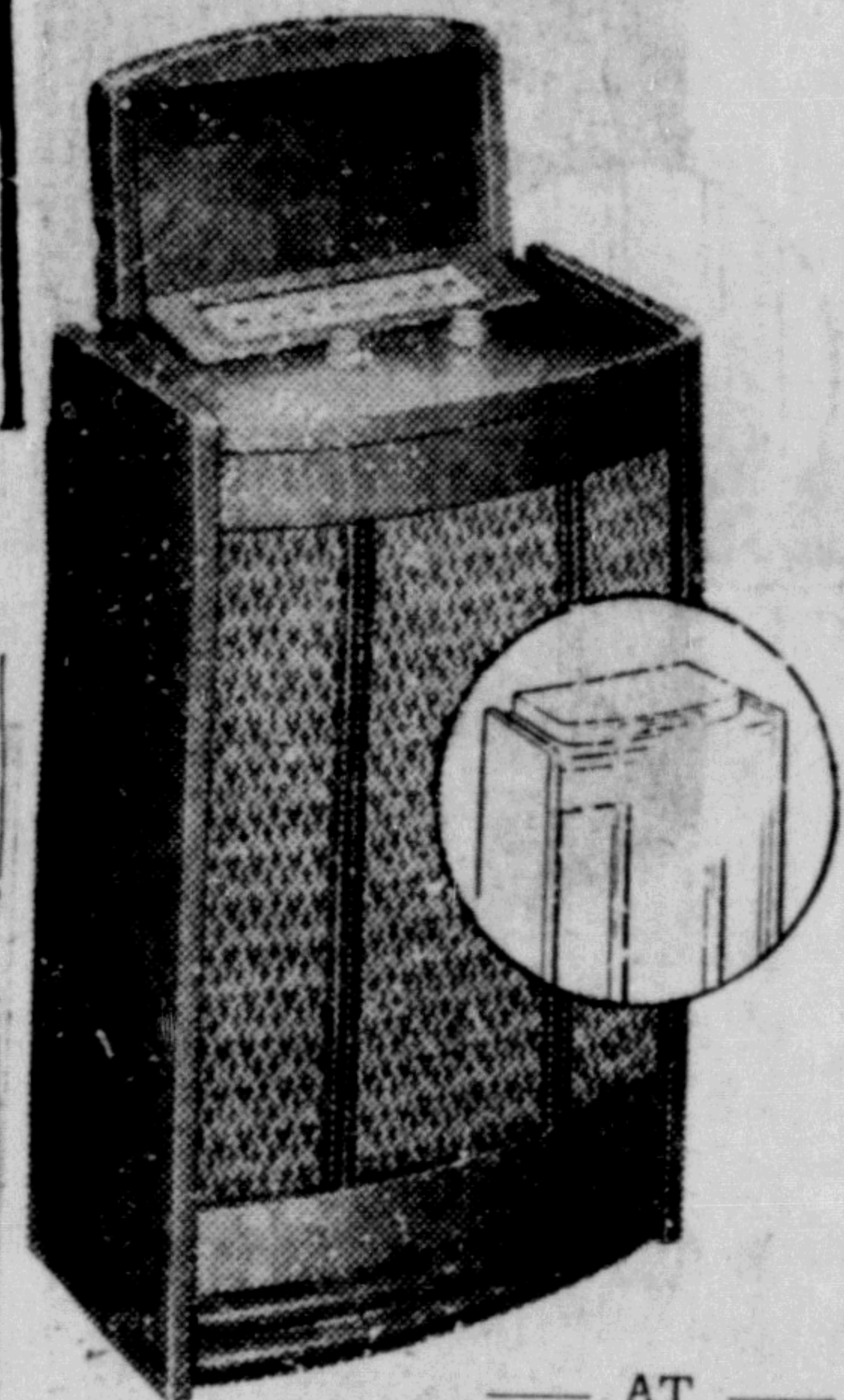

terms in which it was passed up. The Board agreed that the uncertainty of this procedure made it impossible for students to plan ahead, and as a consequence, prospective students were lost. However, they withheld decision until the next meeting in order to give the matter more consideration.

A further recommendation—that the annual tuition fee for senior matriculation be set at \$100—was agreed to by the trustees. They were told that the cost of a similar course at the University of British Columbia is \$225.

"When the people of the community understand that there will be senior matriculation and that the rate will be \$100, I feel that in a community of this size, there always will be a sufficient number to make the course self-supporting," Mr. Hurst stated.

Although assurances had been given that there would be at least 10 students taking senior matriculation this year, there were only eight in the class at the end of the month and one student has since decided to leave, Mr. Hurst said.

**ROYAL CITY'S OLD FASHIONED PUMPKIN PIE**

2 eggs, lightly beaten  
2 cups "Royal City" Pumpkin  
1 teaspoon cinnamon  
1/2 teaspoon mace  
1/2 teaspoon nutmeg

1 teaspoon ginger  
1/2 teaspoon cloves  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
3/4 cup light brown sugar  
1 tablespoon molasses  
1/2 cup top milk.

Mix all thoroughly. Cook in top of double boiler just until the steam rises. Place in a baked pie shell. Sprinkle with a little extra nutmeg and put in 375 F. oven for 15 minutes. Cool, and serve.
