London Women Seek Well-Paid Hubbies

Marriage Mart Finds Little Demand For Shy Laborers

LONDON, (P) - Women in search of husbands are "turning up their noses" at coal miners, bus drivers and every kinc of worker bringing home less than \$30 a week says Mary Blair, head of a London marriage bur-

"I have on my books 200 men under 35, who are in manual jobs.. They are looking for wives who wealth be satisfied with a modest income. Unhappily such wives are hard to find just now.'

Most of the women who come here looking for husbands want men from the professions-white collar types.

Miss Blair said the majority of male applicants seeking help from marriage bureaus are "the shy type who find it difficult to strike up an acquaintance with

"Some of them tell me they go to public dances but are too nervous to ask anyone to dance with them. Such men usually go to a marriage bureau in search of a wife."

In the hopes of finding "homey" girls as wives for the working man, the Mary Blair Marriage Bureau is slashing its registration fees for this type of applicant from five guineas to two guineas.

PLYMOUTH, England (1) -Plymouth's medical health officer, Dr. T. Pearson, says the time has come to do something about the standard of food hygiene in Britain.

In his annual report the officer said that a razor blade had recently been found in a mince pie, a ten-inch square of dirty rag in a meat patty and a twoinch nail in a loaf of bread.

Too often, he added, there was "evidence that food-preparing premises are vermin-infested."

British health authorities have launched a national campaign for a general tightening up in food hygiene.






