METZ DOMINATES SECOND ROUND OF GOLF OPEN
VANCOUVER. —Nick Metz, of Virginia Beach, Virginia, on Thursday beat par and the rain for the second successive day to take a two-stroke lead at the half-way mark in the Canadian Open golf championship, but two Vancouver men loom as powerful threats.
Metz shot a scizzing 71—one under par—to bring his total to 138 for the two days.
At least half a dozen other golfers, including Vancouver's Fred Wood and Stan Leonard, could take over the leadership before the 72-hole tourney ends Saturday. Leonard finished up with one under par Thursday—a 71—for a total of 143. Woods posted the same count.
Metz' closest rivals are Herman Kelsor of Springfield, Missouri, and Johnny Palmer of Baden, North Carolina. Each have a score of 140.

PENNANT BATTLE BECOME CRUCIAL

NEW YORK. —The three-way fight for the American League pennant enters its showdown stage today when the Boston Red Sox and the Cleveland Indians tied for the lead, and the New York Yankees, only one game behind, open a crucial series.
The Yankees flubbed a chance to pull into a three-way tie yesterday when they were beaten 4-2 by the cellar-dwelling Chicago White Sox.
All contenders have eight games left but the schedule favors the Indians.
