TORONTO — Port Arthur's rugged West End Bruins edged out a narrow decision to win their third straight victory last night over Barrie Flyers in the Memorial Cup final series and moved to within one game of the Canadian Junior hockey championship. The score was 5 to 4. After the game, Barrie said it would not play a fourth game in the best of seven series unless there was a change of referees. Port Arthur needs but one more win to take the cup.

MIGRATION OF BIRDS RECORDED

BURNS LAKE — More flocks of migratory birds have been in evidence during the past two weeks than ever before in the history of the Central Interior. Thousands of robins, woodland thrush, juncos, warblers, blue-birds, chic-a-dees and black-polls have been feeding on the lawns in the village of Burns Lake, while a few swifts and swallows are taking advantage of the mud to build their nests. Suddenly they nearly all disappeared with the exception of a few hardy robins which remained to brave the morning frosts. Overhead, flock after flock of Canada geese honked their discordant way northward, daily and far in to the night. A great flock of sand-hill cranes circled Burns Lake for hours at a high altitude. A small flock detached themselves and flew south. This flock could be identified by the leader, a one-legged crane which had landed annually for years in both spring and fall on the open fields of the Braaten farm near Uncha Lake, and is quite at home even in the barnyard. This flock shows a slight increase as the Braaten Farm has proven to be a Sanctuary.
