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
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
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NEW TYPE OF MACHINE FOR SPRAYING FRUIT-A new type of fruit spraying machine, shown during its demonstration at Marden, Kent, Eng., is hauled by a tractor to the site to be sprayed. The invention is unusual in the fact that previous machines have used high pressure while the "Autoblast" uses low pressure insecticide with high pressure air. This mobile plant virutally created its own hurricane, which, impregnated with insecticide, is carried to the topmost branch of the highest tree, and so applies a fog-like drench of pest destroying insecticide that completely envelopes the tree.

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
