# The Budget

A A INISTER of Finance Anscomb's budget speech in the Legislature yesterday brought us upto-date on British Columbia's financial position. It told how the province is spending its heavy revenues and what it plans to do in the way of future outlay. Actually the budget speech was a reflection of the recent development program as announced by Premier Johnson, giving further details of the financing thereof and, incidentally, disclosing some particulars from the dollars and cents standpoint.

It was disclosed by Mr. Anscomb how huge are becoming the costs of social services and the substantial proportions that aid to municipalities are. assuming. Much of this is being financed by the everitable gold mine of the much-protested and still unpalatable three percent sales tax which sounds possibly a little sweeter under the resounding title of "Social Security and Municipal Aid Tax." Incidentally, there was not the least indication of any amelioration of the impost.

Out here in the west of Central British Columbia we will be waiting with interest to hear how much of the Johnson-Anscomb melon we shall be getting. We have already acknowledged the general benefit that we should all experience through the government's Pacific Great Eastern extension project and its active efforts to encourage the establishment of industry in this rich basket of natural resources.

Possibly Mr. Carson will be disclosing soon some more details of the public works program which we hope will provide a substantial measure of outlay for these parts which are contributing more and more to the government coffers.

### A GOOD MAN

F THERE is one member of the provincial cabinet who commands the respect and esteem of all persons, regardless of their political stripe, it is Hon. George Pearson, minister of health and welfare. Under dramatic circumstances, Mr. Pearson told the Legislature Thursday that "politics is the ruination of government." He appealed to new members of the House, and in so doing, gave occasion for reflection to the old ones as well, to "stick to their principles" regardless of political considerations. Mr. Pearson was speaking to the men and women of all parties and, knowing him as we do, we can acknowledge that he spoke from the heart. That is the kind of a man Mr. Pearson is and everybody who knows him knows that what he said and the manner in which he said it came from the depth of sincerity.

Hungary's Communists published a bitter attack on the cardinal who was later convicted and sentenced to life imprisonment. They called his trial a defeat for the west.






