Wednesday's Game—

Epic Battle Of Hurlers

PHILADELPHIA — Vic Raschi, big New York Yankee fireballer, bested amazing Jim Konstanty of Philadelphia Phillies Wednesday in a brilliant pitching duel as the American League champions scored a 1 to 0 victory in the World Series opener. Fogging his fast one down the middle in the clutches, Raschi set the young Phils down on two hits—both singles—and didn't allow any opponent to reach third. He struck out five and walked one.

Konstanty, starting his first game since 1948 and his first in the Big Leagues since 1946, was almost as good as Raschi, his control and "stuff" allowing the Yankees only four hits. Russ Meyer relieved him in the eighth when Konstanty was yanked for a pinch hitter and allowed only one hit the rest of the way.

The damage came in the fourth when lead-off batter, Bobby Brown, third baseman, doubled. Hank Bauer drove deep to centre when Ritchie Ashburn had to catch over his shoulder on the run and Brown went to third. Gerry Coleman lifted one out to left for the second out but Brown scored easily on the throw-in. That was the game.

Konstanty was in trouble in the first inning on a walk and jingle but got the Yank's big shots out easily.

In the third Raschi singled. Gene Woodling walked and moved to second and third on a sacrifice but Konstanty again got heavy-hitting Yogi Berra, Joe DiMaggio and Johnny Mize to fly or foul out. He walked six and struck out one.

With one out in the fifth, Willie Jones got his first hit through the box past Raschi and Andy Seminik, with two out, moved him to second on a solid single. But Mike Goliat fanned.

Konstanty's appearance had been much as a surprise because, although he holds the modern record, made this year, of appearing in 74 games as a star reliever, he was not expected to start.
