Criminal Cases Now Concluded

Charged separately, Simon Muldoe and Clarence Wells, both natives from Hazelton, both pleaded guilty at Supreme Court Assizes today to charges of receiving one case of beef, knowing same to have been stolen.

Each was fined \$50, and the pair were ordered to pay \$29.76, the value of the stolen goods. Both fines and the damages were paid.

T. W. Brown prosecuted in both cases. Darrall S. Collins defended Muldoe. R. M. MacLeod defended Wells.

As these cases concluded the criminal docket for the court, Mr. Justice Clyne dismissed the jury. In doing so, he thanked them on behalf of the Crown for their services and the sacrifices they had made from their regular activities.

The Assize is now proceeding with civil work.

The ancient typewriter in the office of the secretary of the Prince Rupert Chamber of Commerce is at last to be replaced. The Chamber, at its meeting Monday night, authorized the purchase of a new machine from McRae Bros., who offered a substantial trade-in allowance for the old one.
