## Booster Pump Still Pumping

The critical city water supply picture is much the same, Mayor Rudderham stated Monday morning. The booster pumps at the emergency pumping plant at Shawatians continue to maintain a flow of between 2,400,000 and 3,600,000 gallons of water per day.

No immediate danger is in sight, the Mayor said and, although a few of the lateral lines are frozen, the city mains are in good condition. However, it might be serious if a large fire broke out. In that case, all lines would be closed in order that sufficient water be concentrated for fighting purposes. In an event of that kind, thousands of dollars might be involved in repairing the lines that were damaged by the frost.

At present, two city thawing machines are at work on num- erous lateral lines which have frozen up.
