SEALED TENDERS endorsed "Tender, Government Liquor Store, Prince Rupert," "Tender, Government Liquor Store, Vanderhoof," and "Tender, Government Liquor Store, Terrace," will be received by the undersigned for the erection and completion of premises for use as a Government Liquor Store at Prince Rupert, on Lots 19 to 22, inclusive, Block 11, Section 1, Plan 923, Second Avenue, City of Prince Rupert, B.C., and for erection and completion of premises for use as a Government Liquor Store at Vanderhoof, on Lot 24, Block 1, fronting on Stewart Street, Village of Vanderhoof, B. ### HOUSEKEEPING

Honey was one of man's first foods. At one time it was considered a priceless treat, used only at celebrations of greatest importance.

The habits of the bee are the same today as a thousand years ago but man has improved the method of gathering and marketing honey. He has, however, not been able to duplicate it. The flavors of honey are due to the aromatic substances found in the nectar of flowers and therefore honey varies from time to time. Since taste preferences vary, one flavor may be more pleasing to the residents of one locality than that produced in another section of the country. Honey producers frequently blend several honeys to obtain a uniform color and a flavor that is generally appealing.

Another item of interest reported at Wednesday's Board of Trade meeting by Mr. W. Robinson, was that the frame of the mill of the Dorreen Gold Mines Ltd. is almost completed. Peter E. Peterson, director and manager of the mine, has stated that gold leads and 3 or 4 base metal leads have been opened up and these may increase the value of the property, set up production and increase the continuity of the operation.

The telephone office will be seeking a new location soon, since the property on which it now stands is being required by the new tenants of the Sundal Apartments who plan to open up a restaurant. The Government Telegraphs have had notice to vacate.

### Small Fruits Recommended

Do Well in Central B.C.  
Says Experimental Station Chief

PRINCE GEORGE — Small fruits such as strawberries, raspberries, currants and gooseberries do very well in most districts of Central British Columbia, says F. V. Hutton, Superintendent, Dominion Experimental Station, Prince George. In the light snow-fall areas as south of Quesnel, it may be found necessary to supply protection for strawberries in the form of about four inches of clean straw or marsh hay. Where a good covering of snow comes before the ground freezes hard, this is not necessary however. Raspberries can be protected if severe top kill occurs by turning the canes down in the fall after the leaves fall and placing a shovel of earth near the tip to keep them down. The earth is removed when the ground is dry enough to work in the spring. Currants and gooseberries will require no protection.

Strawberries recommended are Gem or Pixie where an ever-bearing type is desired and British Sovereign when a June bearer is preferred. We recommend raising them by the matted row method rather than the hill system. Raspberries recommended are Laham, Herbert and Chief. If the grower wishes to protect the top as suggested, he may be able to grow more tender sorts such as Taylor and Washington. Currants recommended are blacks — Boskoop Giant and Black Naples; reds — Stephens and Red Lake; whites — White Cherry.

Gooseberries recommended are Pixwell which is red when ripe and Cosmo which is green. Several large European sorts are under test but none can be recommended for general growth.

**HONEY ICING**  
1/2 cup honey  
2 egg whites (stiffly beaten)  
Pinch of salt  
Heat the honey to a rolling boil and continue boiling for 1 minutes, 2-3 degrees F. The honey will thicken somewhat but care must be taken to prevent

it from scorching. Pour slowly in a thin stream into the egg whites, beat continuously until the mixture is fluffy and will hold its shape. Add flavoring if desired. This mixture may be used as a topping for desserts or as an icing for cakes. Yield: sufficient for 1 nine-inch cake.
