Impressed with the future outlook for the central interior city of Prince George is Maurice Brydges who has returned to the city after a ten-day business trip to various interior points between here and there. Everyone at Prince George is confident that their is destined to become central British Columbia's biggest metropolis due to its strategic position as a transportation centre and its industrial potentialities.

The well paved streets of downtown Prince George might well be an example to Prince Rupert, Mr. Brydges says. He also noted that the streets there are well marked with signs, something which Prince Rupert lacks.

The highway between here and Prince George Mr. Brydges found to be in deplorable condition at this time. There is deep mud in all but a few sections and between Telegraph Point and Salvus the potholes are particularly bad. Highway traffic into Prince Rupert can hardly be expected as long as the road is allowed to remain in such conditions.
