SHIPS and WATERFRONT

Due to inclement weather which commenced about 11 o'clock last night the C.P.R. steamer Princess Norah was delayed until 5 a.m. this morning on its southbound voyage to Vancouver. It was scheduled to remain in port until 11 p.m. at which time the Eugene, Oregon high school band concert and dance was to end at the Civic Centre. Passengers disembarking at Prince Rupert included John Conley from Juneau and Edith Longley and 8-year old Dennis Lattery. Miss Longley is accompanying the lad to his home in Prince George and will return to her home at Juneau.

Capt. David Ritchie, veteran halibut skipper of Prince Rupert, is back in the city after a trip up the coast from Ensenada, Mexico to Vancouver with his son, James Ritchie, in the latter's forty-foot salmon troller Kingfisher. The younger Ritchie had taken his boat to Mexican waters with the intention of fishing tuna, having been misinformed as to the regulations. The result was that he fell foul of the Mexican authorities and was detained at Ensenada for six weeks with his boat. With the assistance of the elder Ritchie, matters were finally cleared up and the Kingfisher was enabled to return to Van-

cover. It was an exceptionally rough trip for the small vessel, particularly northward from Eureka, California, to Cape Flattery and the Straits of Juan de Fuca

With a substantial list of passengers and freight cargo, C.N.R. steamer Prince George, Capt. William Eccles, arrived in port at 10:15 yesterday morning from Vancouver, Westview and Ocean Falls, sailing at midnight for Ketchikan whence she will return here this evening to sail at 11:15 on her return south.
