HUGE POWER DAM SITE CONSIDERED

BURNS LAKE—John T. Gawthrop, director, regional development division, Department of Trade and Industry, consulted local authorities here last week as to the control of the huge watershed of Tweedsmuir Park. The canyon below the outlet of Cheslatta Lake is under consideration and also the outlet of Nataikuz Lake in to the Nechaco River. Transportation of material will be no pack-train or dog proposition and a railroad to the selected site will be a necessity.

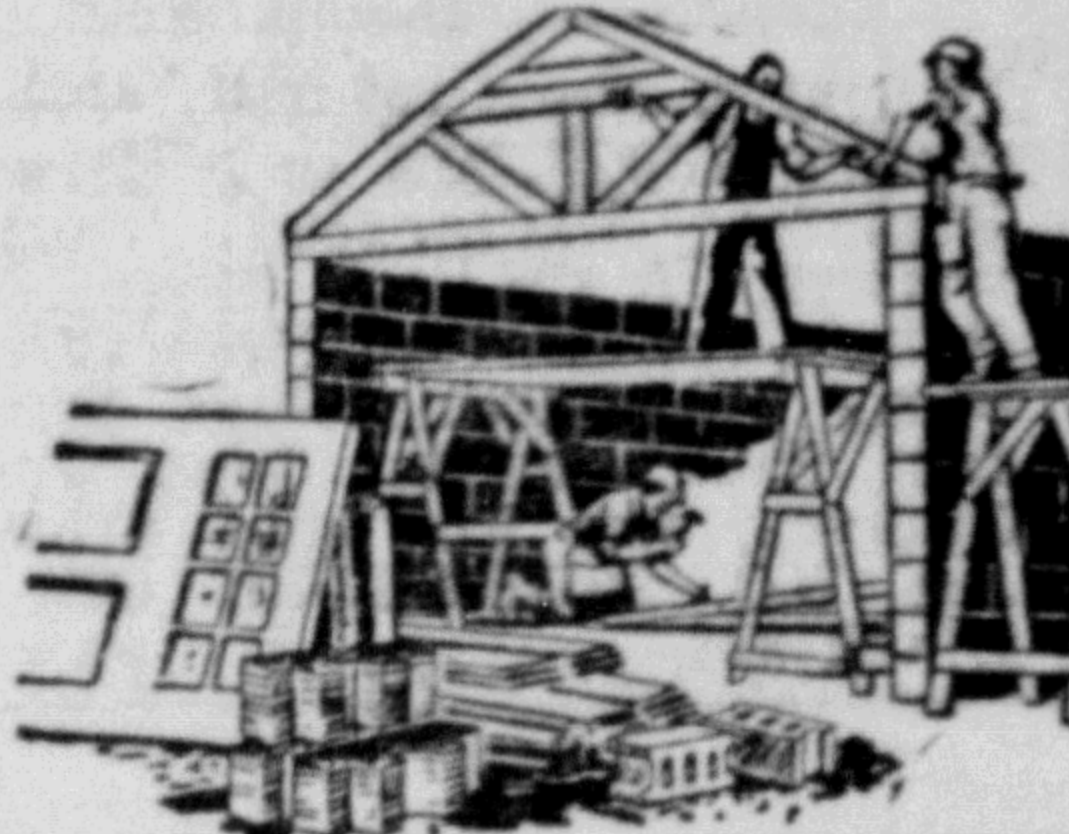
