Seasonable Ideas for Housekeepers

HOT BREADS FOR LUNCH AND SOME OTHER INTERESTING SEASON IDEAS

What to have for lunch is an ever-present problem. Something tempting yet satisfying is what the meal planner is always seeking.

Hot breads, plain or fancy, fill the requirements. Plain baking powder biscuits or muffins with honey or jam are ambrosia to many people. There are others who prefer coffee cakes or loaf breads either hot or cold.

All breads and biscuits of this type are made pretty much by the same method and require careful handling. There is an old ballad which goes like this: Cookin's like religion is Some's lected an' some ain't An' rules don't no more mek a cook Den sermons mek a saint Such sentiments make an excellent alibi for the cook who turns out poor food but home economists do not agree with it. They say that if the rules are followed exactly there should be no failures.

Spider Cake
1½ cups corn meal
½ cup sifted all-purpose flour
1 teaspoon baking soda
½ teaspoon salt
¼ cup sugar
2 eggs
1 cup sour milk
2 cups sweet milk
2 tablespoons shortening
Mix and sift corn meal, flour, soda, salt and sugar. Combine well-beaten eggs, with sour milk and 1 cup of the sweet milk. Add to first mixture. Melt shortening in a 9-inch frying pan. Pour in mixture, then add the remaining cup of milk without stirring. Bake in a moderate oven, 350 degrees F., for 50 minutes. When the cake is baked there will be strips of custard across it. Cut and serve in wedges. Yield: Eight servings.

Feather Squares
1 cup sifted all-purpose flour
½ teaspoon salt
2 teaspoons baking powder
½ cup sugar
1 egg
½ cup milk
4 tablespoons shortening, melted
2 tablespoons brown sugar
½ teaspoon cinnamon
Mix and sift flour, salt, baking powder and sugar. Stir in beaten egg, milk and melted shortening, mixing only enough to combine. Pour into a well-greased 8" x 8" x 2" pan. Combine brown sugar and cinnamon. Sprinkle over batter. Bake in a hot oven, 400 degrees F., for 20 minutes. Cut in squares and serve hot. Yield: 16 pieces (2" x 2").
