



U.S. Emergency—

WASHINGTON (P)-The United States Army today called for a total of 160,000 draftees in January and February, nearly doubling the quotas it had announced previously for that period.

It acted in line with President Truman's decision that the United States must raise its military manpower sights beyond the goal set before recent reverses in Korea-2,000,000 men by next June 30.

The President will speak to the nation Friday night and, in the meantime, it is suggested, may call a national emergency.
