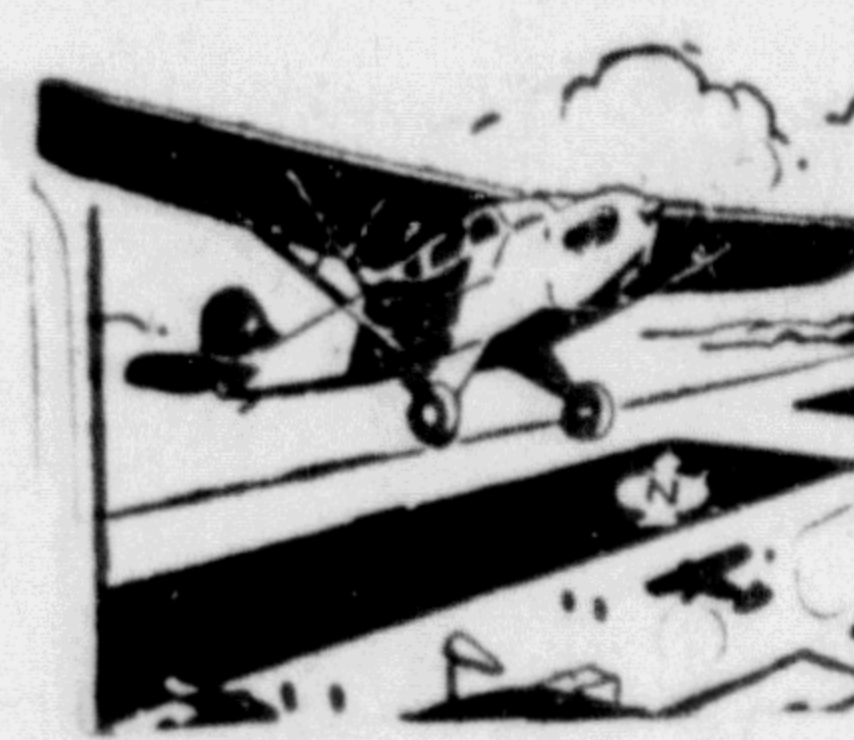

Most people who live along the coast have seen porpoise in their natural environment but it is seldom that one is seen on dry land. The one displayed at the fish docks is relatively small, being approximately 4½ feet long. In appearance, and to the touch, its body is similar to hard rubber.
