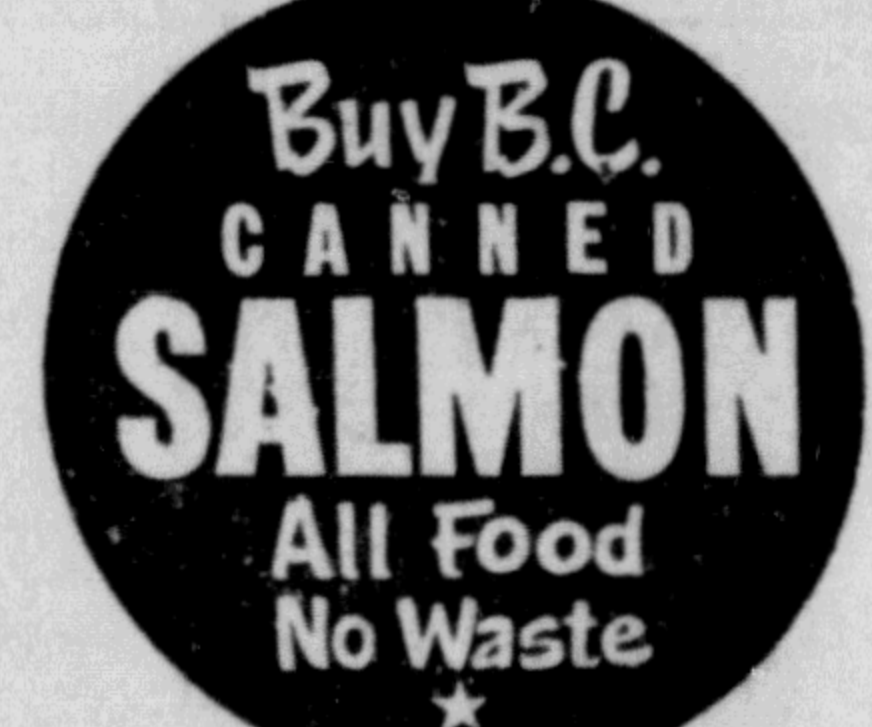
Bogus Tens May Be From Mid U.S. Ring

Try this economical Canned Salmon Loaf. *Ingredients:* 1 lb. Canned Salmon, flaked; 1 1/2 cups milk; 3/4 cup bread crumbs; 3 eggs, separated; 2 tsp. lemon juice; 1/2 tsp. lemon rind; salt and pepper. *Directions:* Scald milk, add crumbs and cook 5 minutes, stirring constantly. Add beaten egg yolks and cook over hot water (double boiler) for 5 minutes, still stirring. Cool slightly, stir in fish, seasonings, lemon juice and rind and finally fold in beaten egg whites. Turn into well greased dish, set this in hot water and bake for 3/4 hr., in 350-375° F. Serves 4.
