BATTERY EARNS RIGHT TO MEET LEGION IN STUART SHIELD FINAL

GUNNERS DEFEATED BATTLING HIGH SCHOOL 3-1 IN FIRST ROUND

In last evening's first round of Stuart Shield football, 102nd Battery deservedly won over High School and so earned the right to meet the Canadian Legion in the final of the competition next Sunday afternoon. The score was 3 to 1 for the Battery.

Play was ragged at the start with players on both teams mis-kicking at times.

Ward's centre was dangerous and then Cornwall went close with a hard drive. Boulter kicked away in another Battery attack and then the students got going. McKay and Mercer combined neatly and Olsen did some fine checking and feeding his forwards. Pavlikis gave Boulter a hot handful but the goalie cleared. At the other end Wilson was very nearly through.

Dunbar and Holkestad made ground but Hebb cleared. Veitch stopped a dangerous move and Boulter did well to save from Ward and then from Pavlikis.

Wilson set Owens up and the latter's shot was just wide. Battery attacked. Cornwall opened the scoring with a good shot after the ball had hit the crossbar. Olsen fed Wilson but Ferguson bottled him up. Mercer drove in a beautifully placed shot from a free kick but Morgan saved splendidly. Morgan saved a tricky header from Wilson following Olsen's through pass. Then Boulter mis-punched the ball and Pavlikis headed a second goal. High forwards all combined in a fine move but James was safe. Sharpe drove

in a great shot but Morgan saved and then Pavlikis drove high over from close in.

High defence was lax after play resumed and Boulter had to be quick to save from Dunbar. Cornwall made a clever run. Boulter was lucky when he mis-kicked after Hebb missed and when Dunbar had an open goal he hit the upright. Sharpe was clever and a fine cross from McKay went across the goal.

Holkestad made a good run and set Pavlikis up but the latter shot over when he had the open goal. High attacked and, after a well-executed forward move, Mercer scored the best goal of the match when he first-timed Owens' centre into the top corner of the net. Boulter punched away Ward's corner kick and then James intercepted the ball to stop Wilson. Play was fast from Pavlikis topping the bar and then McKay and Mercer forcing their way through until Gomez and Ferguson finally stopped them. Boulter made a good save from Ward but slack backplay let Pavlikis in and he made the score 3-1. Wilson, Mercer and McKay combined but the latter shot over. High attacked again and Wilson gave Owens a set-up with only Morgan to beat but Owens was too slow. Hebb sent the Battery back and Lien and Owens both went close. Sunberg came through with a fine tackle and run. Gomez made a fine run but duns beat him. James again stopped a High School attack and Olsen tried a couple of shots but the whistle went with the Battery winning 3-1.
