Federal Department Informs Board of New Deal

Announcement was made by F. E. Anfield, Indian Superintendent, at the meeting of the school board last evening, that a new policy, relating to education of Indians had been adopted by the Department. Aid will be provided, particularly with respect to buildings, in the way of outright grants.

There will also be per capita grants to municipal school boards to be negotiated on the basis of per capita costs of school operation.

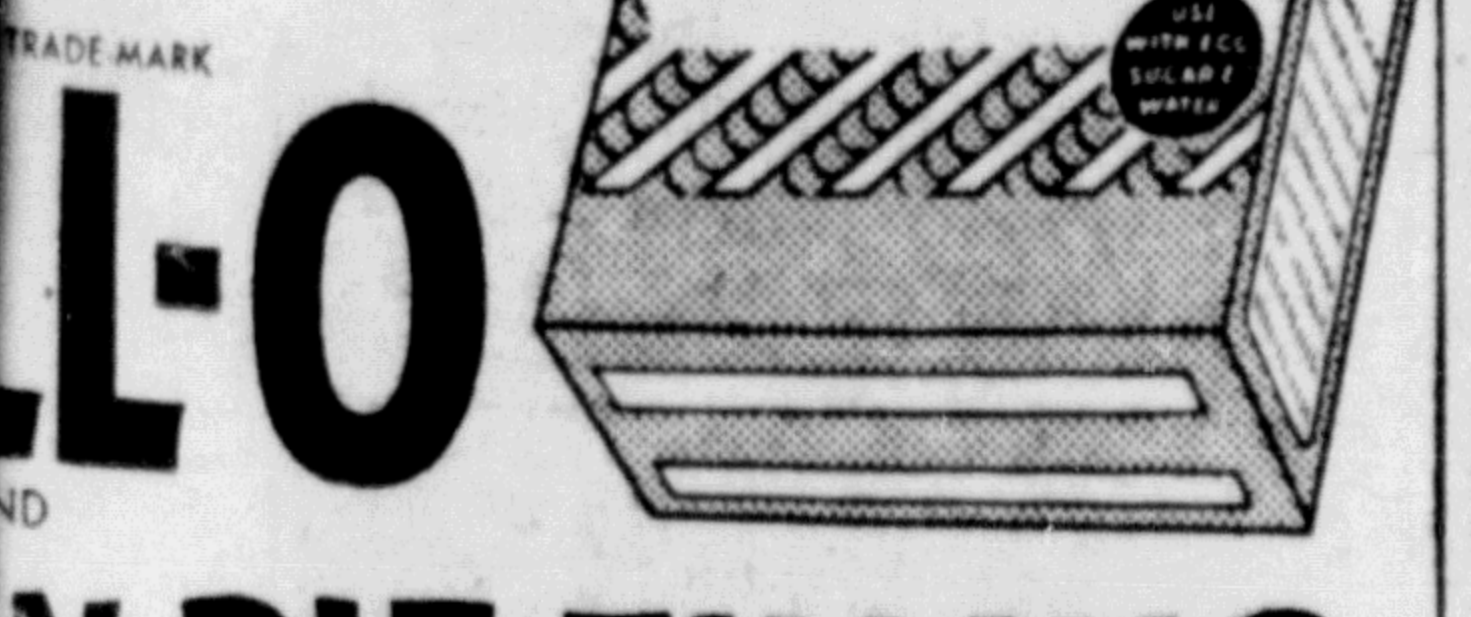

Temp. 350° F. Time 30-35 minutes
1/2 cup lard, shortening or home-rendered fat
1/2 cup brown sugar
3/4 cup Crown Brand Corn Syrup
1/2 cup boiling water
2 1/2 cups sifted pastry flour
1 tspn. baking powder
1 tspn. baking soda
2 eggs, well beaten

Cream lard, shortening or home-rendered fat and gradually beat in sugar and Crown Brand Syrup. Add boiling water and let stand until lukewarm. Then add sifted dry ingredients in 3 lots, beating well after each addition. Add well-beaten eggs and blend mixture with a rotary eggbeater. (This is a very thin batter). Pour into a well-greased pan 8" or 12" and bake in a moderate oven (350° F.) for 30 to 35 minutes. While still warm, dust top with powdered sugar.
