SHORT SPORT

Harry Greb, three-year king of the middleweights, was dethroned 29 years ago last night by Tiger Flowers of Atlanta, in a 12-round bout at New York Madison Square Gardens. Flowers, who became the first Negro to hold the division title, lost to Mickey Walker the same year and died shortly afterwards.

Glenn Cunningham set a world's indoor record for the 1,500-metre run at New York 10 years ago tonight. The barrel-chested miler from Kansas covered the "metric mile" in three minutes, 48.4 seconds, clipping 1½ seconds from the former mark set by Gene Venezia, who finished second, 35 yards behind Cunningham.

George "Twinkletoes" Selkirk, so ticklish he giggled himself out of wrestling into baseball, was put on the spot 13 years ago when he was mooted as successor to Babe Ruth, the game's greatest home-run hitter. The Huntsville, Ont. born player promptly made good and tickled New York Yankee fans with a first-year .312 average.

A member of the crew of the American motor ship Palisana, which has frequently called at Prince Rupert, found himself in trouble recently. Rudolph A. Halemba was fined \$200 in Juneau by Judge George Folta for the theft of a case of butter. He was indicted on a charge of larceny in a boat. The charge was reduced to theft of goods from interstate commerce. The former charge provides only a jail sentence.
