Prince Rupert's newly formed  
Soroptimist Club may take the  
renewal of the swimming and  
diving floats at the Salt Lake as  
its initial project. First regular  
meeting of the women's service  
club, held last night in the Civic  
Centre, favored this plan after  
discussion of projects.

Feasibility of the project will

dangerous to use.
