"This makes one wonder why we do not make a Number One road from which to show tourists the finest scenery in B.C."

"There are many people driving cars around Prince Rupert who know nothing about the problems of road building and maintenance simply because they will not travel them in their present condition. So those in authority take it for granted that the road is good enough as it is. May I suggest that, since it is possible to drive over the road from Prince Rupert to Terrace without any difficulty, but not at 40 mile an hour, every motorist who can should get behind his steering wheel and head for Terrace."

"They will see the diversion around the Kwinitsa snowslide and will be aware also of the need for better road building and maintenance machinery so that the men who do the work willingly and efficiently can make a better showing by producing more miles of road per dollar spent, rather than more dollars per mile of road improperly maintained."

"When one realizes that 54 miles of heavy snow must be kept off the 94-mile stretch between Prince Rupert and Terrace, there can be no question of whether or not it is a boy's job to be done with toys or a man's job to be done with the best of tools and equipment procurable, and these used in co-operation with the railway company."
