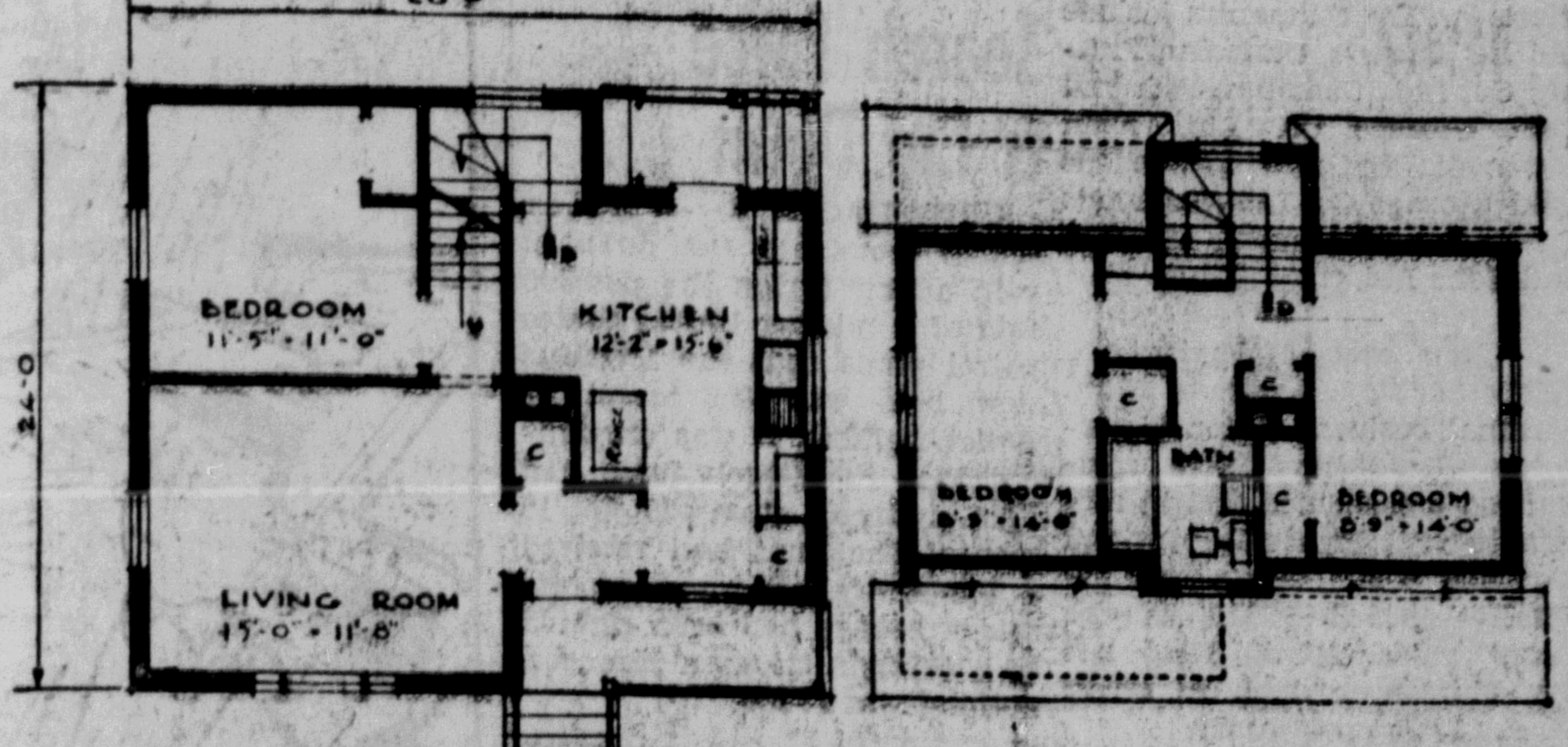
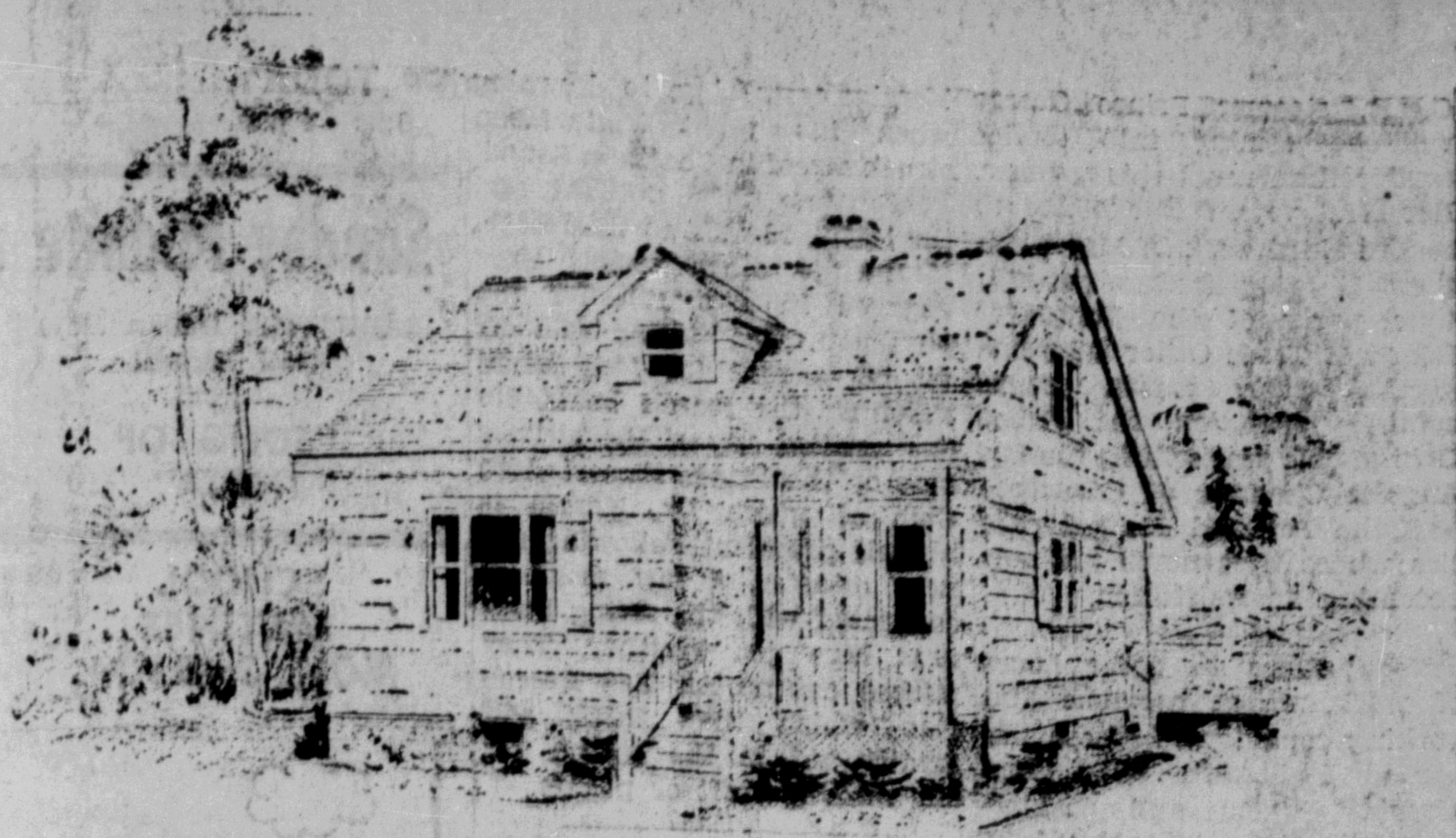

POPULAR FOR SMALL TOWN—This 1½-storey house is very popular, especially in small towns and rural areas. It combines a pleasing exterior appearance with a simple and practical floor layout. Designed for comfortable living throughout the year the plans include two porches and large, airy rooms, including three bedrooms. The large living room (15'0" x 11'8") is well lighted by two wide windows. A small central hallway connects the living room with the 'country' kitchen. One entire wall is devoted to shelf and sink space. A rear entrance connects the kitchen with the back porch. Another door leads to the basement where there is ample space for storage, laundry and heating facilities. The large master-bedroom completes the first floor layout. On the second floor there is one large bedroom on each side of the house. Each bedroom contains a large stand-up closet. There is also an additional linen closet near the bathroom. The front dormer window provides light for the completely equipped bathroom. For estimating purposes the total floor area is 1,964 square feet; cubic contents 15,399 cubic feet. Home to Italy—  
Holy Year and Family Reunion  
Mr and Mrs. E. Pettenuzzo  
Leaving Next Week

Mr. and Mrs. Emilio Pettenuzzo, pioneer residents of Prince Rupert, will be Holy Year visitors to their native Italy and will visit the Vatican in Rome where they expect to see the Pope. They are leaving the city next Monday and expect to be away until September. It will be their first visit to their home land in thirty-seven years. Mrs. Pettenuzzo will take part in a family reunion in her native province of Padua of which Venice is the principal city.

Mr. Pettenuzzo has two brothers in Padua, one of whom Eugenio, lived in Prince Rupert from 1909 to 1921.

In addition to Rome, the Pettenuzzos will visit Milan, Turin and Pisa as well as Lugarno, Switzerland, where Mrs. Pettenuzzo's mother died five years ago. Paris may also be included on their tour before they return home, sailing from Genoa for New York on the steamer Brazil.

Mr. Pettenuzzo is one of the early pioneers of this city, having first come here in 1909. In 1912 he went back to Italy to be married and he and his bride returned here in 1913 and have not been back to their native land since then. Bruno Pettenuzzo, their son, will be home shortly from University of British Columbia to take charge of their Fulton Street store while they are away.

Also leaving next Monday for Italy will be Mrs. G. Vachner who will spend at least a year and possibly remain in her native Udine province.
