**VOTERS' LIST  
CLOSES MONDAY**

Registration period for new  
voters in the December civic  
election is nearing its deadline.  
The voters' list will close at 5  
p. m., Monday, Oct. 31, as pro-  
vided in the Municipal Elections  
Act.

It would appear that the 1948  
voters list, which here a record  
number of names in the city's  
history, will be topped this  
year, three have been 14 new re-  
registrations.

However, there is still no  
complete record of how many  
names will be dropped from the  
list on account of loss of prop-  
erty qualifications or removal  
from city.

In order to encourage regis-  
tration before Monday, the City  
Hall will be open two hours Fri-  
day evening and for four hours  
Saturday afternoon for the re-  
ceipt of names.

Seven of the 14 new regis-  
trations are non-residents and sev-  
en are license holders.
